Await Completion Metro Plan

Planning Director R. Forrest told Markham Township Council Monday that the controversial official plan for Metro and its fringe areas is not yet completed. The plan is being prepared by the Metro Planning Board. Indica-tions are Metro will amend Markham's sewage plan for the south-west corner of the township. They also want to shift Markham's proposed industrial area from north of the railway tracks to south of it. Although they are in agreement with the need for sewers and water in the first concession as far north as Richmond Hill they are expected to make changes in the second and third conces-

Mr. Forrest said one of the most important factors to determine is just how fast Metro plans to permit develop ment in the fringe areas.


