Await Completion Metro Plan

Planning Director R. Forrest told Markham Township Council Monday that the controversial official plan for Metro and its fringe areas is not yet completed. The plan is being prepared by the Metro Planning Board. Indications are Metro will amend Markham's sewage plan for the south-west corner of the township. They also want to shift Markham's proposed industrial area from north of the railway tracks to south of it. Although they are in agreement with the need for sewers and water in the first concession as far north as Richmond Hill they are expected to make changes in the second and third concessions.

Mr. Forrest said one of the most important factors to determine is just how fast Metro plans to permit development in the fringe areas.

Local Trustees To Name High School Appointee

Richmond Hill Public School Board now has the largest daily attendance of any school system in York Central High School Board district, and this entitles the Richmond Hill Board to appoint a member to the district high school board. Previously the appointment has been made by School Area No. 1. For 1958 average daily attendance was 2,027.6 pupils. Present total enrollment in the local schools is 2,928 pupils.

Trustee Harold Sanderson presented a statement of expenditures as of September 30 at Thursday evening's meeting of Richmond Hill Public School Board in Walter Scott Public School. Estimated expenditures were \$502,230.75, the actual costs came to \$502,689.43.

Let 600 Gallons Oil Escape
Vandals tampering with the pipes and fittings of oil tanks supplying the portables at MacKillop Public School released 600 gallons of fuel oil during or after the MacKillop graduation exercises.

Chairman L. D. Clement stated it was "a most serious thing the solution of which is not obvious." He asked the Building Committee, Trustees C. Williams and H. Sanderson to contact the caretakers and bring in their recommendations.

Deputy-revee Dean wondered if the present fee was sufficient to cover all the costs incurred in land development such as engineering and legal fees. The present lot fee was set in 1954. At present Vaughan charges \$300.00 per lot, while Richmond Hill charges \$500.00 per lot. The committee will make a survey of the charges made by other municipalities and the extent of their subdivision agreements.
