Suggest Markham Extend Their Municipal Franchise

Markham Township Council is not expected to take any immediate action on a request from Markham-Unionville Business and Professional Women's Club that they extend the municipal franchise to include every person 21 years of age, a British subject and a resident of the community for at least 12 months.

In a letter to council the club asked the members to extend the franchise as provided in the Municipal Franchise Extension Act. Any such change would necessitate the taking of a yearly enumeration, of the voters. Such elections could not vote on money by-laws. At present the voters list is compiled from the assessment rolls, and includes all property owners and tenants.

Reeve W. L. Clark felt the proposal required a great deal of thought before a decision could be made. He estimated the number of people affected in Markham Township would be very small and questioned if it would justify the cost of an annual enumeration. Councillor L. Mumberson suggested the issue be referred to the electorate for a decision.

Original Agreement
Council has ruled that the terms of the municipalities original subdivision agreement will apply to the Colmur Subdivision on Bayview Avenue. Following signing of the agreement, council in a new policy decision ruled that all subdivisions must have 28 foot paved roads and storm sewers. The original agreement called for 24 foot paved roads and storm sewers only as required by the engineer. It was estimated this new policy if enforced would cost the subdivider an extra \$96,000.00 to develop his land.

The Department of Highways has turned down a suggestion that they install traffic lights at the intersection of Highway 48 and the Markham Unionville Townline. The department said it may

install two safety islands at the intersection.

The county recently hired three security guards and a matron to handle the transportation of prisoners from the Don Jail to the courts. Any emergency use of these guards will cost \$10.00 each time.

On suggestion of Councillor S. Watson council will request a monthly statement from Dog Catcher R. Herd. Council was pleased to note that the police have issued two convictions against the dumping of garbage on township roads.
