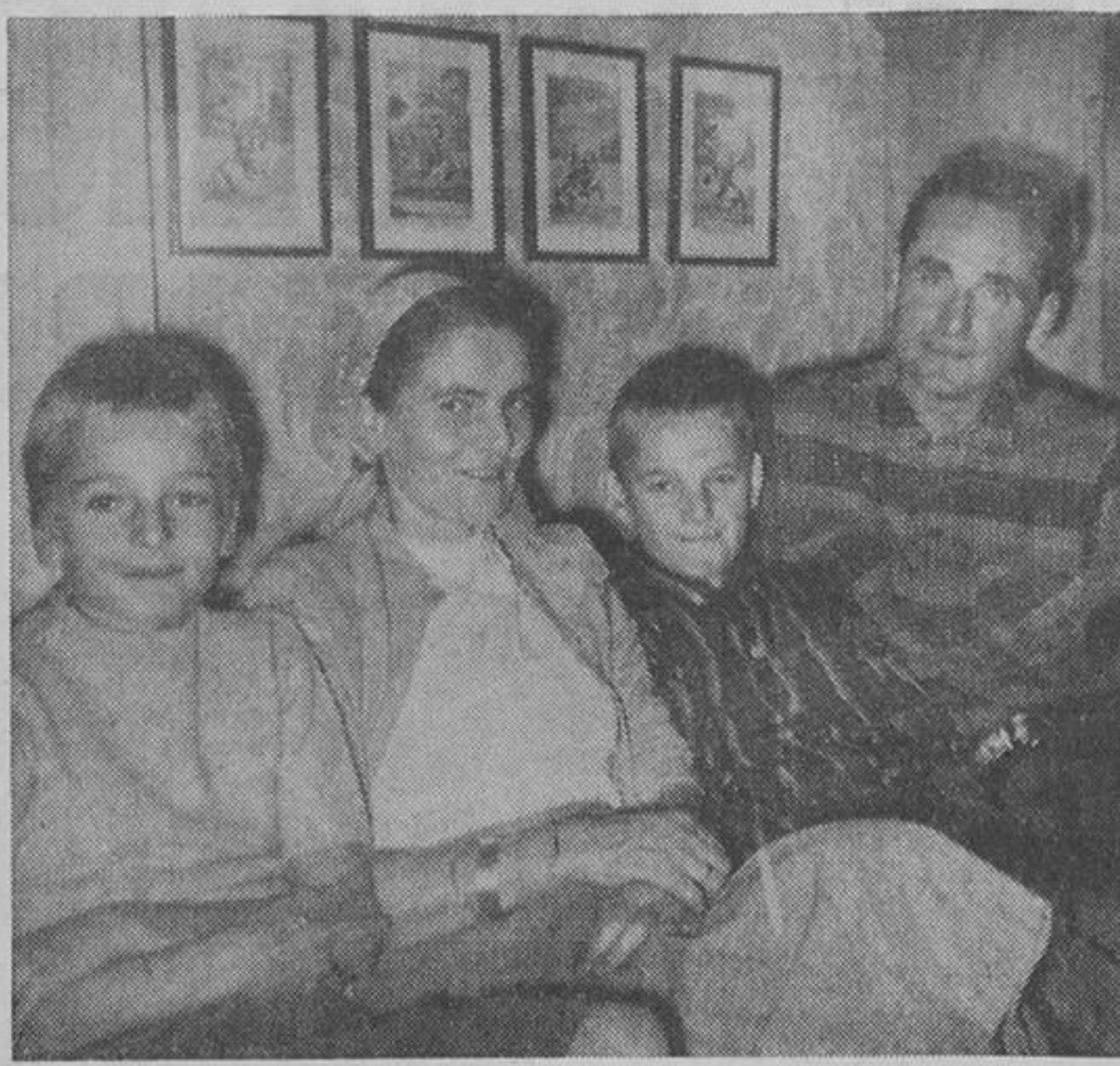

Mr. and Mrs. Sommer, and their two children who now attend Jefferson Public School, came to Canada under the CPR immigration plan five years ago, "and we have loved every minute of our life here", they told us. They love their new freedom, of thought and speech — the respect Canadian residents have had for them as individuals — and the "atmosphere" and the climate (the latter very much like their former home in Germany) which they have found in Canada. Son of a fairly well to do farmer in East Germany, before World War II; deprived of his land by the state, Ulrich Sommer has known much sadness in his life. But that is all in the past and he and his wife and their children are happy now in the new life they are making in this country.

As a boy Mr. Sommer had hoped to be a great artist, "some day". But with the untimely death of his older brother during the war, Ulrich had to bow to the inevitable and become a farmer instead. The land comes first — and he and his father farmed together until a double blow fell and both his parents died.

Then the land he had inherited from his parents was seized by the state for communal farms. "Anything over 200 acres was declared state property and had to be cut up into 10-acre shares," Mr. Sommer told us. "But those who had less than 200 acres were left alone and retained all their land."

Left penniless now and without a home, Ulrich decided to escape into West Germany. Along with other Germans he waited until the freight trains were emptied of their supplies in the east zone; then the group of shivering refugees climbed aboard and hid and prayed. "That first attempt was futile," he said, "but it was not so bad then as it has been since. When we were discovered at the border we were warned and sent back to East Germany. We were disappointed, but we were still alive."

His second attempt to escape came off without a hitch and as soon as possible he travelled to the City of Hamburg and began taking art lessons again. He had a hidden hope and a little help and the proprietor is moving to U.S.A. Ken & Clarke Prentice, Auctioneers. c2w17

Three years ago Ulrich (who is called "Joe" by his Canadian friends because it is hard to pronounce Ulrich and it does not sound Canadian enough) was hired by Mr. Beatty of Drynoch Farms, as assistant to Herdman William Harper, on the beautiful rolling farmland which is situated just north of the Vaughan-King townline. The Sommers have a very attractive and comfortable home, which Gisela and Ulrich have furnished practically, yet picturesquely with the furnishings they have acquired during their five years over here. Pictures of their parents are part of the family scene, as are some of Ulrich's paintings — for he has not given up painting altogether but likes to relax over the drawing board in his spare time — and these add to the homeliness and warm comfort of their Canadian home.

Their children attend the nearby Jefferson school and have made many friends with their quiet courteous ways. Mrs. Sommer sometimes attends the ladies' meetings, which the community club holds from time to time.

And apropos of art, especially paintings, Mr. and Mrs. Sommers remarked, "We attended the private collection of art at the Canadian National Exhibition, it was wonderful." This was of course the art exhibit sponsored by the Canadian Cancer Society. "What a marvelous opportunity it gave people like us — to be able to see such paintings — paintings many of us would not be privileged to see otherwise since they were from private collections."

And to make their satisfaction complete in this new country — which is now rightfully theirs — Mr. and Mrs. Sommers received their final citizenship papers a few weeks ago. They are now Canadians in the true sense of the word, by request and by filial oath.

We sometimes feel, we native-born Canadians may not quite realize what a privilege we enjoy — to have been born a part of this great and majestic land, to which strangers may come for refuge, for peace and for permanent safety. But a visit and talk with our new Canadian neighbours will not only re-awaken us to our heritage but will help them to put their roots a little firmer into their new Canadian homeland.
