Home and School News

The November meeting of the Thornlea Home and School was held at the school on November 18 with Mrs. A. Wright in the chair. Mrs. Wright called on Principal Kinzinger who gave an interesting and humorous talk on "Reading" explaining how it is taught to the first graders, and how reading skill is developed on through the other grades. He suggested that parents could help their children to develop reading skill and a liking for reading by reading themselves and also reading aloud with the children. Nominations will be held in the Buttonville W.I. Hall on Friday, November 27. A question and discussion period followed. Mrs. Tiffin thanked Mr. Hoover on behalf of the association.

Mr. F. Weisener was appointed Safety representative to act on the safety committee for the area. A discussion was held on safety in the area, and one of the main suggestions was a plea for the installation of traffic lights at Bayview and No. 7 highway.
