More Phones In Maple Slight Rate Increase

With the inauguration of dial service on November 1, the Maple local calling area was expanded to allow toll-free calling between this community and King, where dial service went into effect the same day. Maple subscribers continue to have local calling arrangements with Richmond Hill and Thornhill and studies are now being made to include Woodbridge in the toll-free calling area late in 1960.

"With the increase in the number of telephones in its local calling area, Maple moved into a new rate group on November 1," said W. C. Barnes, Bell Telephone manager for this territory.

The new rates, representing small increases for local service, are as follows:

Residence	\$4.40
Individual Line	\$3.45
Two-Party	\$3.15
Multi-Party	\$3.15
Business	\$9.10
Individual Line	\$7.05
Two-Party	\$4.80
Multi-Party	\$4.80
PBX Trunk	\$13.65

These increased rates would have come into effect early in 1960, even if King telephones were not in the Maple calling area, Mr. Barnes said. Because of the expanding telephone needs of Maple itself, the exchange would have outgrown its current rate schedule by that time, he added.

"Telephone rates for any community are governed by the number of telephones in its local calling area and all exchanges are classified into established rate groups on that basis," explained the Bell Telephone manager.

Maple Farm Prize Winner Corn Contest

The results of the York County 100 Bushel Husking Corn Club have just been announced by Agricultural Representative W. M. Cockburn, who is secretary of the Soil & Crop Improvement Association, sponsors of the contest. In spite of the prolonged drought last summer, especially in the southern part of the county, Shur-Gain Farms of Maple barely missed the 100 bushel objective with 99-1 bus. per acre.

In second place was C. L. Winger of Gormley, with 92.6 bus. The others in order were: Clarence McDowell, Stouffville, Trevor Watson, Markham, Massey-Ferg, Farms, Milliken, Douglas Hope, Newmarket, Master Feeds Farm, Thornhill, Walter Brillinger, Gormley, R. J. Darlington, Maple, John Reesor, Unionville.

The yields are computed on the basis of 15% moisture of shelled corn. The moisture content ranged from a low of 29.5% to 46.4% in the samples taken by the judges and submitted to the Ontario Agricultural College for test.
