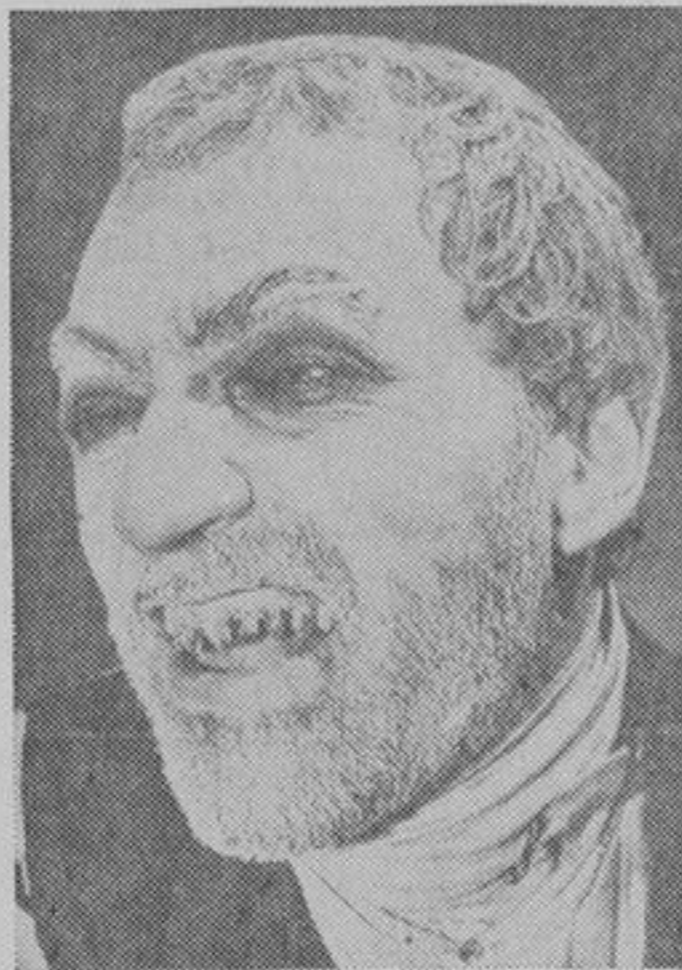

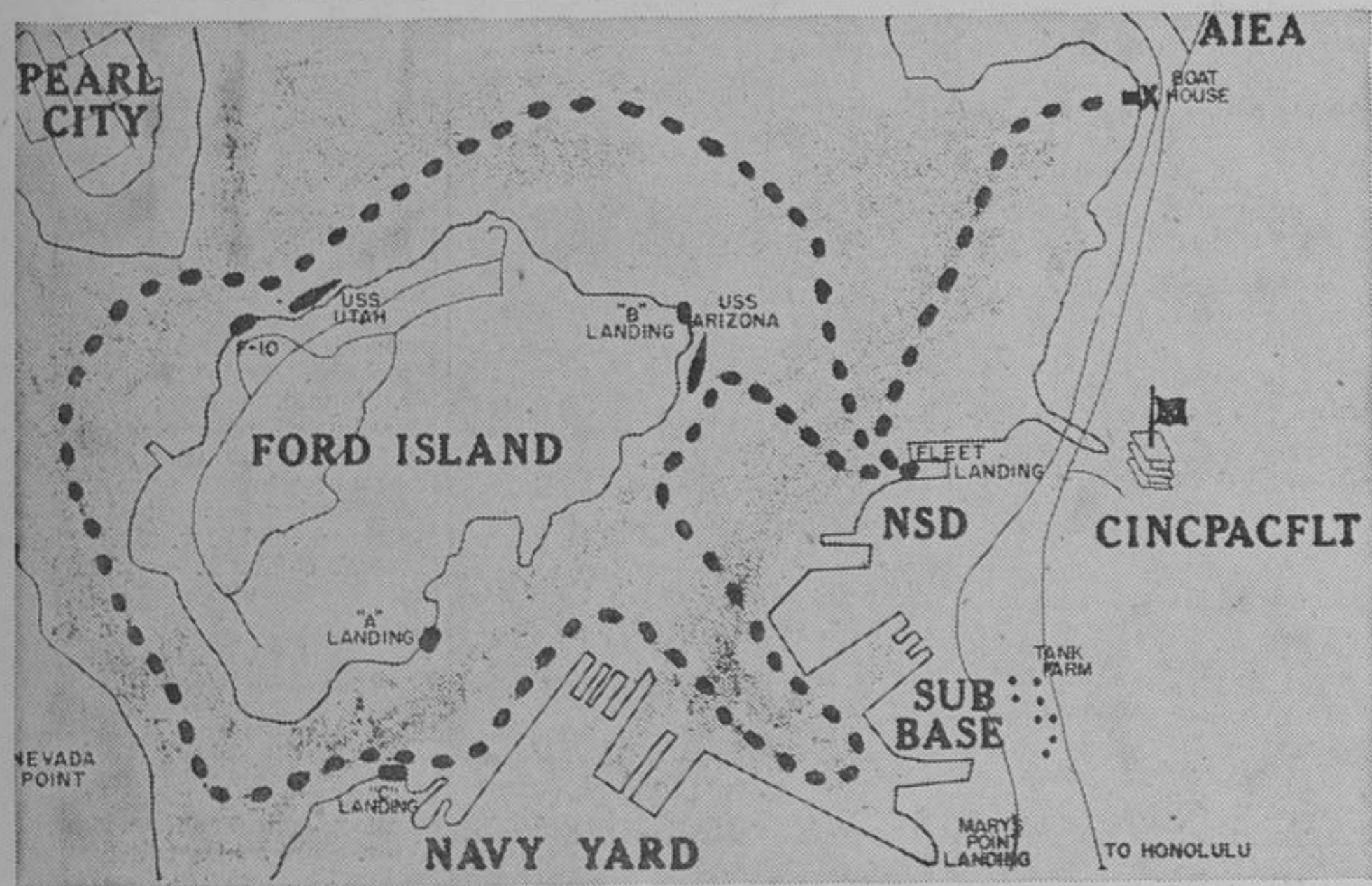


DEFACES HIMSELF—Actor Donald Davis (top) turns into an ugly old man of 80 (bottom) for his startling role in an off-Broadway play.

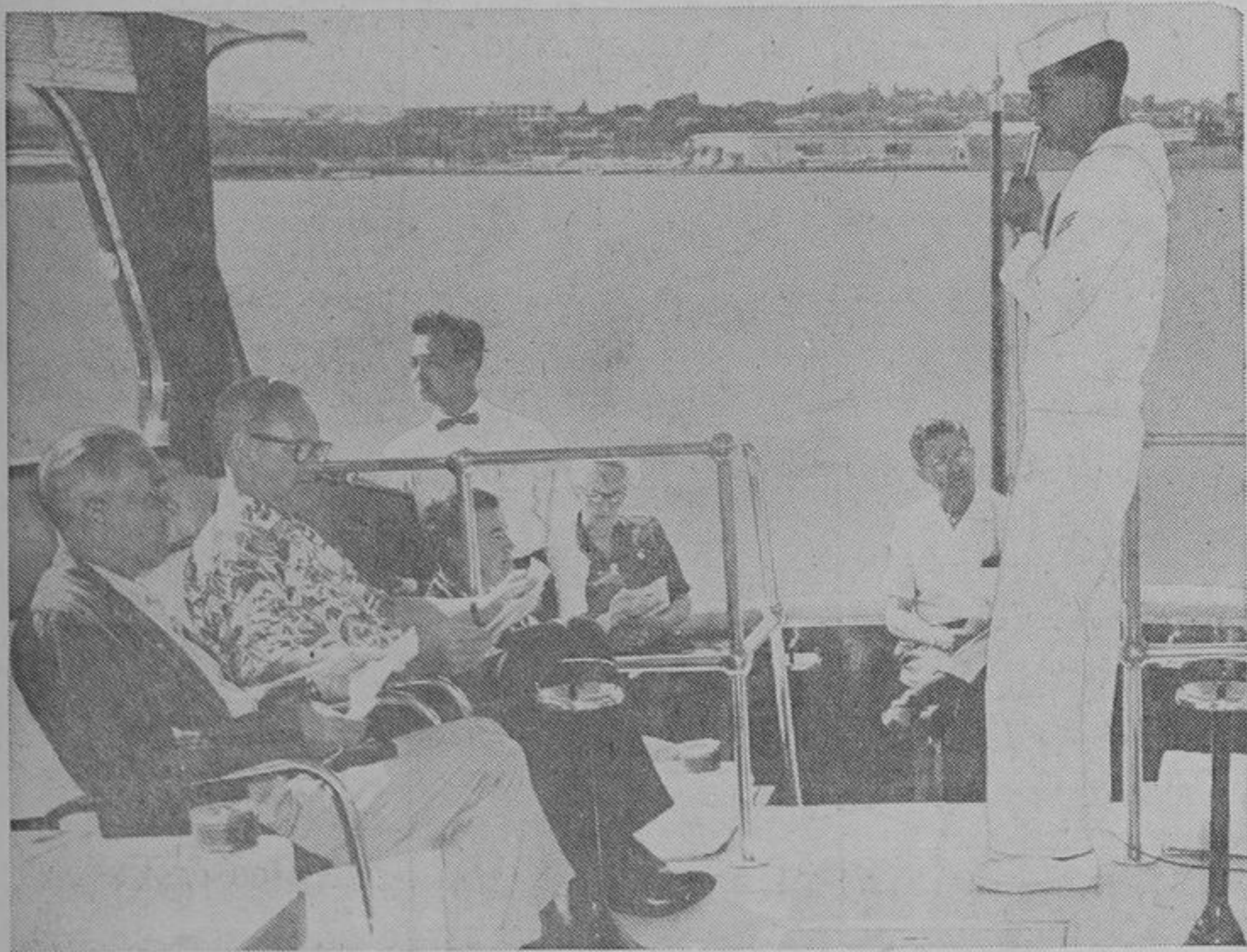

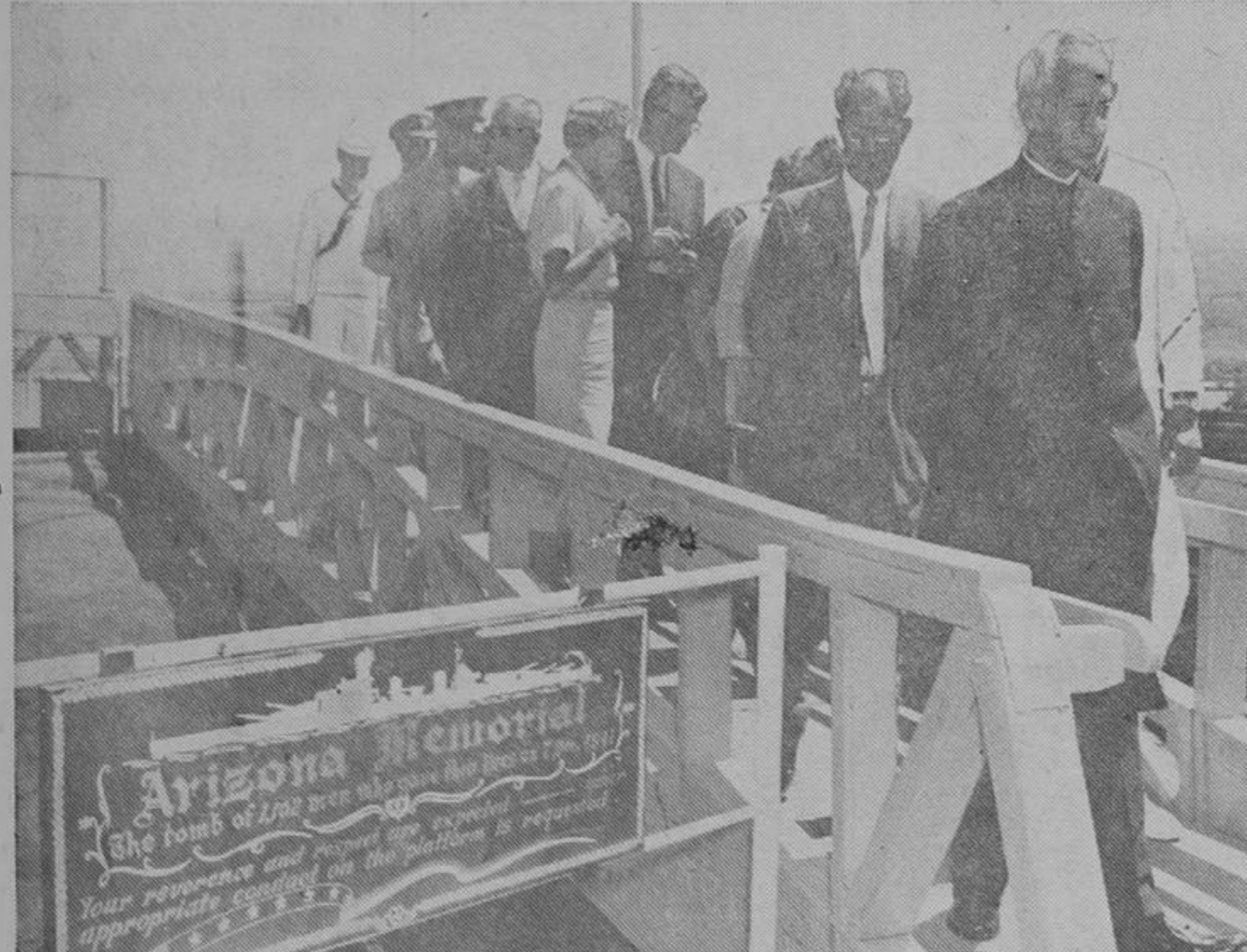
THEY DO REMEMBER

"REMEMBER PEARL HARBOR" is more than a phrase to the Navy men who conduct guided tours of the area, including the site where the battleship Arizona sank under a Japanese onslaught. A boat crew takes more than 12,000 civilian and military persons on tours of the historic harbor annually. The seven-mile-long circuit of Ford island comes complete with a lecture on Pearl Harbor's history as well as the landmarks. High point of the trip is the stop at the sunken Arizona. Each boat crew member is an expert in seamanship and good safety rules.
