Talented Actress Guest Speaker at University Club

Monday evening, February 29, members of the University Women's Club of York County were privileged to have as their guest speaker the fascinating Miss Jane Mallett, well-known actress of radio, television and the theatre.

The talented Miss Mallett, who has had wide experience in all three media, confined her remarks chiefly to a description of how a television show is produced. She expressed nothing but the deepest admiration for the very large number of highly skilled individuals who work behind-the-scene miracles to present viewers with a smooth-running T. V. drama. The somewhat technical subject did not suppress the actress's own inimitable humour, which revealed itself many times as she related some personal experience or described the various hazards encountered by a television performer, with swinging microphone booms, scenery in motion, falling props and endless lengths of cable.

In introducing Miss Mallett, Mrs. Carol Davis of King referred to her talents not only as a comedian but as a dramatic actress as well. This was evidenced by her performance in the role of Julia in a recent T. V. production of "The Cocktail Party." She has been the star of eight "Spring Thaws," was the moving spirit of the revue, "Fine Frenzzy," was on the first television show when T. V. began in Canada, and has had roles in many G. M. Theatre productions on television.

Miss Mallett does a great deal to encourage young actors and is interested in the whole acting profession. She is President of and moving spirit behind the Actors' Fund, as well as a member of the Councils of Actors' Equity and the Association of Canadian Radio and Television Artists. Miss Mallett became serious in discussing her work with these organizations and the plight of performers in the Canadian theatre today. Progress has been made but much more must be done to protect the artist and give him some security. In relating some of the difficulties encountered in the development of Canadian theatre, she deplored the tendency of newspapers to devote pages of favorable coverage to sports events and sporting figures, while little, and often critical, coverage is given the theatre and its performers.
