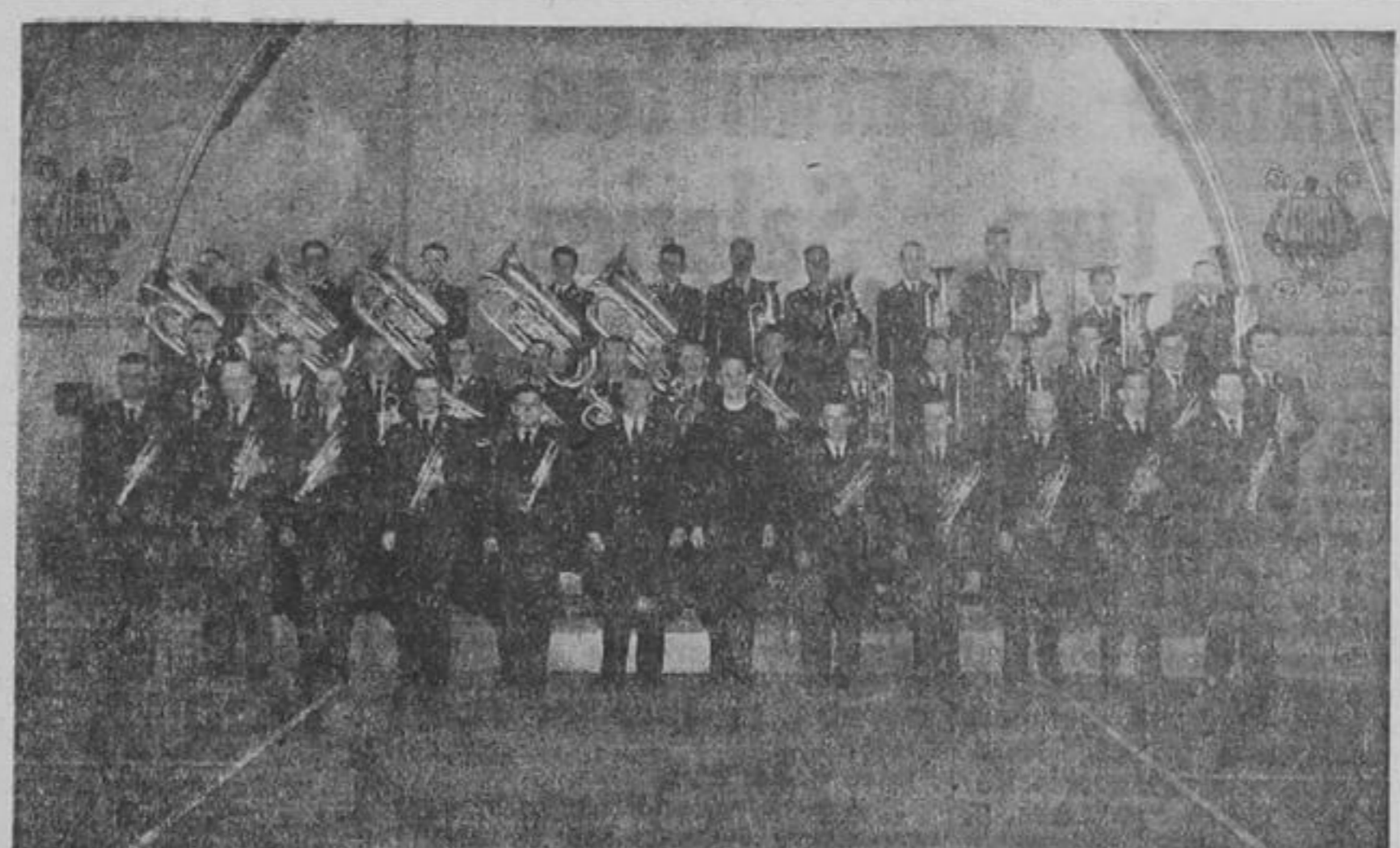

METROPOLITAN SILVER BAND
To present concert in Richmond Hill United Church auditorium Friday evening, March 25, at 8.30 p.m.

The Metropolitan Silver Band was originally formed as an independent group in 1931, under the leadership of Mr. Alfred Pearce. They joined the Metropolitan Church in 1934 and have been an active unit there ever since. For most of these 26 years, the band played every Sunday evening in the church and every Sunday afternoon in the church hall. In recent years, present-day business pressures and wide spread growth of the city forcing people to come long distances, have forced them to cut down on some of this activity. The band has an average membership of about 40 men who have come to the band from a variety of places. Some are graduates from former Metropolitan Junior

Bands, some are from other Toronto bands and others come from far away places including the British Isles.
A number of the bandmen served with the RCAF band overseas during the last war and three of these, including the bandmaster, Mr. Alan Wood, are still active in the work of the band.
Mr. Alan Wood has been bandmaster for the past 10 years. The band has long had the reputation as a top competition band at the Canadian National Exhibition in 18 entries, they have turned in an enviable record of 15 first prizes and three seconds.
The repertoire covers just about everything from the Classics to popular Broadway show music. Every bandman plays in a com-

pletely voluntary capacity, finding the band a wonderful outlet for his musical talents and affords the pleasure of passing these talents on to anyone interested in good band music.
