Babies ordinarily acquire the ability to sit up between 6 and 9 months. When children first learn to sit up they usually lean forward in a position that appears strained but it is actually a slumped or relaxed attitude. Muscular development and co-ordination progress rapidly and in a little more than a few weeks the child can maintain proper balance while sitting. Sitting up is merely one of the steps in growth leading towards the later development of more complicated movements, such as standing and walking.
