

lege graduates have about the function of farm organizations. Those forums who considered agriculture college graduates mainly, felt they had some, if not adequate understanding, while others felt it depended on the background of the individual graduate. Those with farm backgrounds would have some knowledge of the functions of farm organizations whether they were agricultural graduates or any 7 other. More groups, including the Edgeley group said it was not true that College graduates had no understanding than believed this statement. However, the majority did not commit themselves one way or the other. They felt some graduates - even most had no understanding of the functions of farm organizations, or that most ha little understanding, but almost all forums agreed that a lack of this knowledge was a serious handicap for those graduates who were working with farm people. Said the Edge-

ley Forum members "It would be a handicap if the graduates didn't understand farm agricultural functions." And they also added that they thought college graduates working in agriculture should be able to obtain short courses in farm organization policy. The Ontario Forums were nearly unanimous in this feeling.

Opinion was about equally dicurriculum or as a short course during the college education and those who thought it should be taken after graduation, those who felt it didn't matter whether it was taken during or after, and those who thought this type of course should be included during the college education and continue from time to time after graduation in order to keep up with the rapidly changing times. Edgeley Forum members felt that a post graduate course in this matter would be most effective as the student "could then specialize in whatever job they were working at and in that way get more benefit from the short

Generally speaking, one could conclude that Ontario Forums are in avor of helping college graduates to obtain a broader understanding of the functions of farm organizations. There was quite a decided feeling that farm people themselves might benefit from a similar knowledge.
