Small Car Rates 10 Percent Lower

A 10 per cent rate reduction on small and compact cars is being introduced in Ontario this week by State Farm Mutual Automobile Insurance Company.

Norm Briant, local agent for State Farm, also announced a reduction in liability rates for nearly two-thirds of the firm's policyholders in Ontario.

In addition. he said State Farm's second car discount of 2 25 per cent will apply on top of the compact car reduction, bringing extra savings to many families with a small second car.
