Mrs. Spencley was a good neighbour to all who knew her, and through the years proved a great source of motherly comfort to many a young wife with a growing family. During their years at Elgin Mills, Mr. Spencley worked part-time as a driver for "The Liberal" and was wellknown in Richmond Hill.

Five years ago Mr. Spencley retired from farming, following a heart attack, and he and his vife moved to Scarborough to live with their son and his wife and family.

Surviving with her husband Fred are all their sons, Malcolm R.; Donald F. of Goodwood; Rev. John B. of Peterborough; Robert W., of Sunderland; and Howard G. F., Cardiff, Ontario. The funeral was from McDou-




