In the Hamilton Spectator of March 19, 1867, a Victoria family sewing machine was advertised for \$15. and butter was 15c lb. It also advertises a trip to California - 22 days via Panama Canal by Steamship.

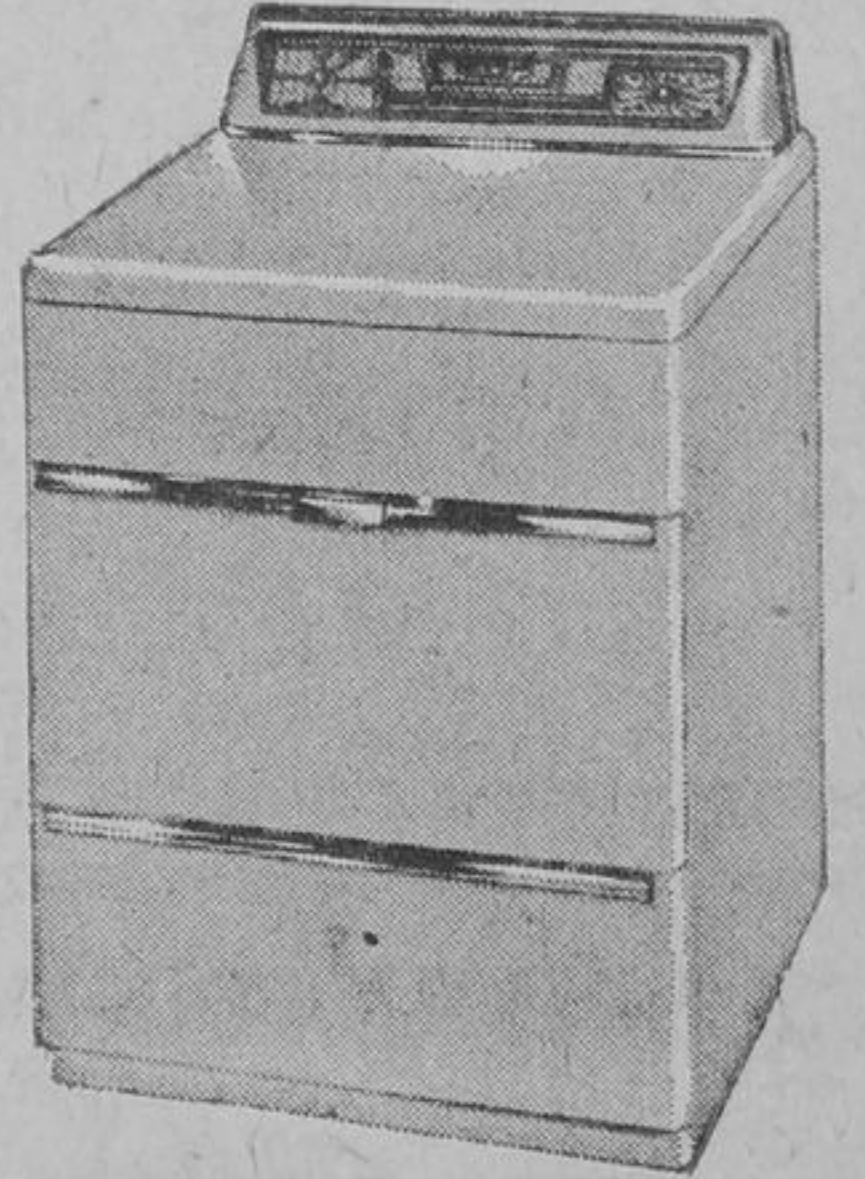
