Street Light

Monday night received a request from Mrs. G. Magvas for the installation of street lamps on the existing pole at the entrance to public easement on Osiris Drive. Mrs. Magvas in her letter stated "this section of Osiris Drive is poorly lighted to begin with because of a large empty field directly opposite. I have always felt uneasy about this situation as it is not the safest thoroughfare for women or teenagers at night; in winter months of early darkness and T. The rejoinder, from the harassed police officials was, "What do you mean try the blood? -- The mosquitos have dragged the carcass off the road already."
