Race For Vaughan School Board

There will be no shortage of public spirited citizens on the upcoming Vaughan Township School Board. Of the nine nominations received Monday evening at the Maple Community Centre, the 400-member audience gave the 8 who accepted lusty cheers. Milton Savage, Jr., of Patterson, while nominated for another term, declined so that he might make a bid for council. Three other trustees of the present board are in the running again this year, the fifth, Mrs. Ruth Hogg, will retire at the end of 1960.

Candidates for the five-member board were called to the platform for their acceptance speeches in the order they were nominated. Chairman Pierre Berton introduced as first nominated contestant, Mrs. Dorothy Robertson of Pine Grove, attired in a bright coat and a bit of a saucy white hat. Mrs. Robertson said that if elected she would do her best. "I'm a newcomer," she admitted, "but have spent 10 years in community work and feel I am familiar with problems common to all of us. I've raised four children and have two in high school, so I'm not entirely unfamiliar with school problems. I'd appreciate your vote and if elected will hear in mind that we live in a large area and will try to be fair to all sections."

Herbert A. Constable of Maple, incumbent board chairman, said he was a lifelong resident of the township, a secondary teacher and the father of two boys. "Prior to becoming chairman of the present board," he said, "I was board member, secretary-treasurer and chairman of the old Maple School Board." He said he had hoped to have a few minutes to review the progress of the new board over the past year but would defer that review and report at other meetings between now and election day. "I wish to thank my board colleagues," he concluded. "They have been unfailingly co-operative and hard workers on behalf of the school supporters."

Cecil J. Neil O'Reilly of 103 Pemberton Road, Yongehurst, kept his speech to a minimum. "I'm a newcomer, too," he said, "and all I have to offer is lots of time with which to look into problems pertinent to a school board, and a keen interest in educational matters."

Ross Scott Jolliffe, a Thornhill sales manager, said: "I offer to fill the office as trustee to the best of my ability and energy."

As the father of four children I am naturally desirous of improving our educational standards and facilities. If an open mind and a willingness to serve commends itself to you I will appreciate your support December 10."

Mrs. Mona Robertson, Elgin Mills, incumbent vice-chairman of the Vaughan Township Area School Board, said "Last year I likened the school area board which came into being last Jan. as a 'founding' thrust on the township doorstep. I now go on record as stating that the 'baby' is not only thriving under the guidance of this first board of trustees but I, for one, would like through your support to continue helping and serving in its development and proper growth."

Mrs. Robertson suggested that continuity of the existing board was vitally necessary for the school children, the teaching staff, the board's administration staff and the taxpayers who have to foot school bills.

Samuel David Kaiser of Kleinberg, chairman of the board's finance committee, said it was a pleasure for him to stand for trustee again, and thanked his nominators for the privilege. "I have had 24 years experience on school boards," he said, "and would like the opportunity and your support to continue the betterment of Vaughan's educational system." Mr. Kaiser has two children, one of whom, a son, is in college.

George A. Chandler, Thornhill, a former trustee of the Markham-Vaughan School Area No. 1 Board, pointed out that he had sat on that board three years. "We spend more money on education than on anything else and I feel with my experience I can be of help on the new board."

Teaching staffs must be of high calibre, he went on, and school taxes must be wisely spent.

Patrick William Salmon, salesman, of Maple, another newcomer, said the father of two sons, said: "If elected as your trustee I will do everything in my power to maintain the present level of education in the township and wherever possible help to improve it. It is a privilege to be nominated and I solicit your support."
