> Won't Oppose Towers Discount Store

Vaughan Township Planning Board, at its February 7 meeting, saw no reason why it should oppose Markham Township's aplication to the Department of Municipal Affairs for approval of an application to amend Markham's Official Plan to permit the operation of a shopping centre opposite the Yonge Street entrance of Helen Street. Vaughan's proposed zoning by-law shows a small commercial (C-I) site directly opposite this 17-acre property on which the Markham centre will cover 150,000 square feet.

The Markham property is now designated as residential and following representation from the Tower Marts of Canada, Markham has approved of the rezoning to highway commercial. This would permit the operation of a discount store, a food store and four accessory buildings. The centre has been approved by the Department of Highways and Metro Planning Board has given the builders the green light subject to some site changes.

Vaughan's planning board said that the shopping centre would not affect its own official plan. The board felt there could be no legitimate opposition to the Markham application and a 'no opposition' vote was duly recorded.

A similar 'no opposition' was recorded relative to North York's Restricted Area by-law amendment in accordance with some requested changes in terminology and definition, floor-area specifications and specific regulations for signs in industrial zones.
