He feels that the board should have some say in regulating vehicle speeds in and near parks. He is lead to this belief personally witnessing an overall disregard of safe speeds by drivers who motor in, to and around the town park. As to spending money on parks, he assumes that the board, which meets once a month, will work out budget requirements and present them to town council. At the moment council is opposed to a by-law setting up operations of the new parks board which would give the board power to make by-laws, and objects as well to voting one mill of the tax rate to the parks guardians. But Stan is nothing if not philosophic and feels things will work out. The growing pressure of sports needs alone, he says, will make itself felt.
