Vaughan Will Borrow \$36,000 Balance Capital Costs Maple Well

Vaughan Township Council, at its regular meeting Monday, approved a recommendation by its waterworks committee, chaired by Mrs. Ruth McConkey, that a by-law be passed authorizing the borrowing of \$36,000 to pay for the balance of the capital costs of the Maple Well. Application to float a debenture issue will now go before the Ontario Municipal Board for approval. When developer J. Grant commenced work on the Normale Subdivision, he agreed to contribute \$90,000 toward the development of a well and pump house. This was agreed upon before the engineer's estimate was in. Subsequently, the cost rose to \$126,000 and Mr. Grant in effect loaned the township \$36,000 to complete the two projects.

Vaughan's administrators say there is no valid reason why the money should not be returned to Mr. Grant, hence the debentures. An area resident wanted to know whether the debentures would mean a higher water rate. Council said that if it did, the increase would be very little, and also pointed out that when approximately 50 more consumers were hooked up a proper financial balance would result. Council agreed that the water shortage in the Elgin Mills area be further studied. More detail will be prepared by the township staff prior to a meeting on April 11 between council members and the property owners. The meeting will take place in the council chambers at 8 p.m.

McConaghy Home and School
 McConaghy Home and School Association held their monthly meeting on March 20th. We were pleased to see so many parents were able to be present. The children from Grade 6 opened the programme with the presentation of the play "Dolly Patchwork." This was very well received by everyone present. Most parents will no doubt have read the write-up "The Liberal" kindly gave on it.

Principal Garnet McDiarmid
 then spoke on the level system, for the benefit of parents who were just coming into touch with it through their children. To quote Mr. McDiarmid "The Work is divided evenly into three parts. Thus most pupils would do three levels of work in one year, six levels of work in two years, and eighteen levels of work in six years. For those adjudged able to profit by a faster pace, four levels could be taken in each year. It will be seen that twelve levels can be taken in three years of time. Since twelve levels are equivalent to four grades of work, the pupil has gained a year and will leave elementary school in seven years instead of eight. On the other hand children who need more time to finish a grade's work might take two levels of work in a year. Since this pupil would take three years to do six levels, (the end of Grade 2) it will be seen that he will leave elementary school in nine years instead of eight. In either case, the change is gradual, and the pupil neither repeats nor skips a whole year's work."
