### Vaughan Adopts Rigid Policy

#### Toughen Engineering Requirements To Guard Subdivision Home-owners

Vaughan Township Council on Monday moved to create a comprehensive and rigid engineering policy relative to all future subdivision and individual building developments within its borders. The final policy will be such as to obviate any possibility of untoward drainage, road and water problems.

Some time ago council suggested that the township's engineering Department assume full responsibility for the installation of services. Recently the engineering heads reported that such a policy would present difficulties. Among other things, the Canadian Engineering Association voiced the opinion that such a policy would tend to give a township engineering department a monopoly on work which should be spread out among engineer personnel in general. In short, the association objected to any tampering with the

free enterprise system. Said Deputy-reeve Jesse Bryson at Monday's meeting: "It's still my personal feeling that our engineers have full say, but I am not unmindful of the association's views."

The compromise effected means that while the design for engineering be the responsibility of the developers' engineer, a rigid policy containing provisions for approval of design and complete supervision and inspection control by the township.

The new policy means that in future no home-owner living in a new subdivision will be placed in a position where he or she will storm the battlements of the administrators with complaints. In effect council said: "Let it be known that our property owners are going to receive complete protection." Experience has shown council that a stitch in time will indeed save nine.
