Some safety precautions for toddlers are to make sure your chidren's toys, playroom furniture and playpen are inspected regularly so that any damage to them will not leave splinters or sharp edges where they could injure the youngster. It's a good idea too to buy only toys that can be washed at high temperatures since most younger children lead a handto-mouth existence and this is the only effective way of keeping toys germ-free. If you use mothballs, which are highly polsonous, put them in a perforated cannister, so your child won't be tempted to swallow them. Cover all unused light sockets. Finally, set a good example for children by following your own safety


