Parents Object To Closing

Re-open Playgrounds On Trial Basis

The Richmond Hill Public School Board has conditionally reversed its decision to close the Pleasantville and Crosby Schools' playgrounds to evening play. At its regular meeting Thursday of last week the board said that for the next few weeks the children will be allowed to use the grounds as formerly on the understanding that the home and school associations of both schools send delegations to the next board meeting to show that the parents in both areas are sufficiently concerned about the recent acts of vandalism to help prevent their recurrence. This year vandalism at both schools has cost the board some \$600.00.

Mrs. William Lennox of Mill Street, who lives just two doors from the Pleasantville School, said: "Closing the school yard robs our children of a place to play and will have the effect of sending them into the streets. There's quite a bit of bad feeling about the board's decision to lock the gates after school hours once the fence has been built."

Chairman L. Clement said: "That's all very well, but the board would feel better if the parents showed a public spirited willingness to help guard public property." Trustee Mrs. Irene Worrell thought that the playgrounds might be allowed to stay open on a probationary basis. Mrs. Lennox thought this was a good idea. "We'd appreciate a probationary period," she said. "And let us remember, it isn't the little children who do the damage, but those 12 to 19 years old. Only recently my husband and I observed two

such boys prowling about the school after closing hours and called the police."

Once the fences are up at both schools there will be the question of who will lock the gates, parents or the caretaker, Trustee Joseph Rabinowitch pointed out. "The further question will then arise, if the parents do the gate locking they will in effect be the board's employees, and the board will be responsible if a child is injured in either yard while playing."

Following more discussion the board took the stand that such and other problems could be dealt with once the fences have been put up. Meanwhile, the yards will remain accessible as usual to the children after school hours, the parents will endeavour to keep a close watch to obviate new acts of vandalism and at the next board meeting each home and school association will send representatives to thoroughly thresh out the matter.

Elgin Mills Home Valued At \$5,000 Is Complete Loss

Firemen trucked water and fought a fire on the Elgin Mills side road for five hours Saturday night before they extinguished the blaze of undetermined cause, which destroyed the Gordon Beauchamp five-room frame dwelling. Mr. and Mrs. Beauchamp and their family were visiting at Penetang at the time.

Vaughan Township Fire Chief Jim Davidson said his department responded to an alarm from the Richmond Hill Police at 9:19 p.m. "The house contained a considerable quantity of paper and other inflammable material," the chief said. "It took us until 2:30 a.m. before it was all properly water-soaked. The material had to be hosed down, turned over and again hosed many times over."

Thirty firemen and four trucks were sent to the scene. Vaughan sent two trucks and crews and Richmond Hill, under Fire Chief Alf Stong, sent two more trucks and crews.

Mr. Jack McLean, Yonge St. businessman who lives in the area, spotted the outbreak shortly after 9 p.m. He put in the alarm and while waiting for the firemen to arrive, in company with W. J. Thompson, fought the fire with water carried from the Thompson well nearby.

While neither fire chief would hazard a damage estimate, it is understood that the frame dwelling was worth in the neighbourhood of \$5,000.

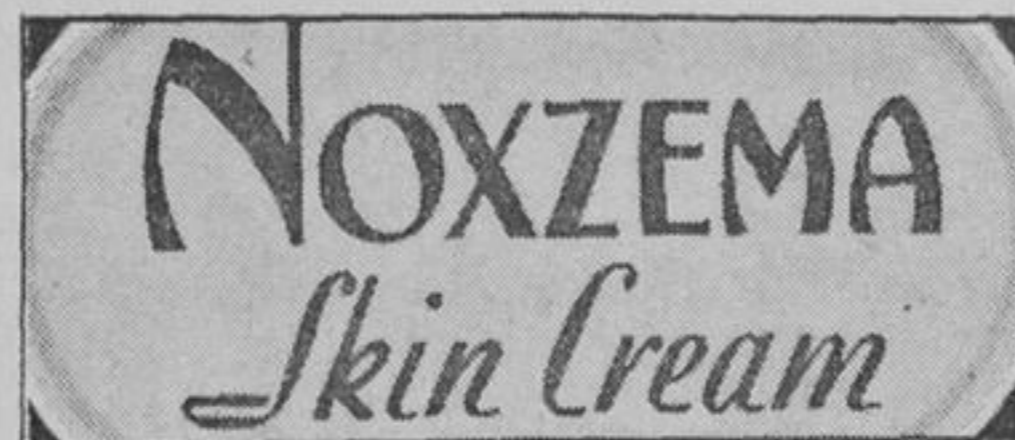

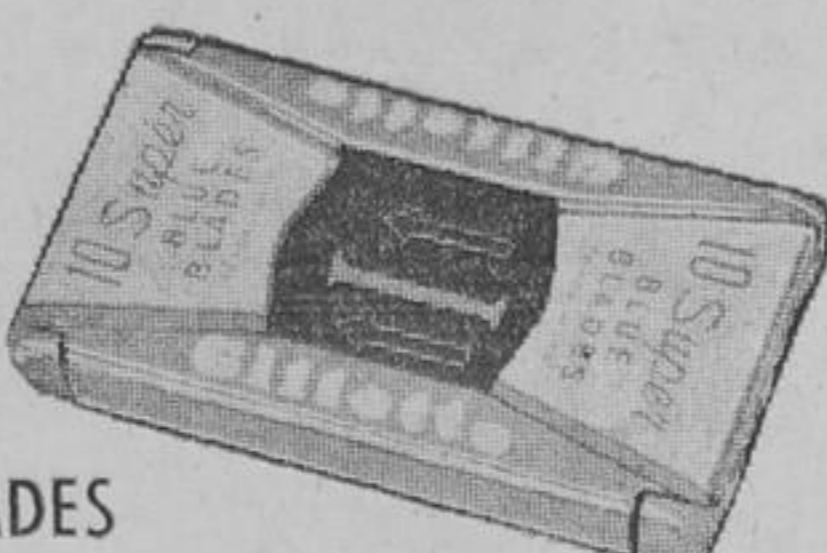

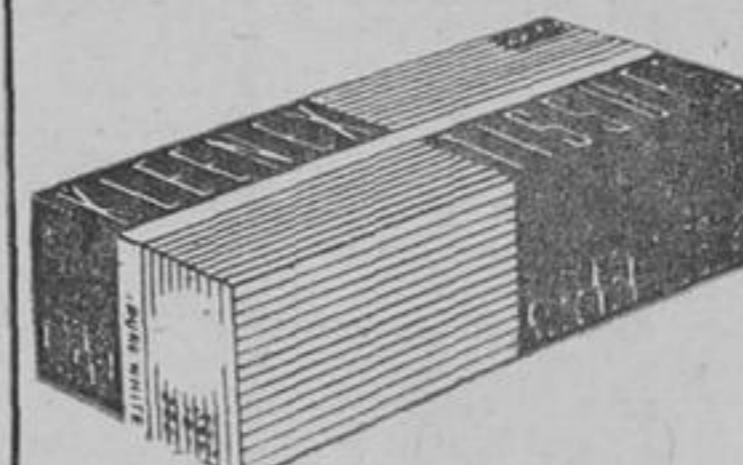
