Ruth McConkey Smiles Through It All

Life In Vaughan Is Hectic Parade Township's Lady Councillor Finds

While life has never been a dull affair for Vaughan Township Councillor Mrs. Hugh (Ruth) McConkey of Maple, since her election last January it has been little short of hectic. As a matter of fact, some weeks are so busy and time-consuming she and her advertising executive husband find it practical to make an appointment with one another ahead of time.

Her duties are three-fold: either driving her own car or mother, councillor and social figure. As a mother of five children and mistress of the former Routley residence with its 14 rooms and three bathrooms, one would suppose she would find little time for other matters. And without the full-hearted co-operation of husband Hugh, three daughters and two sons, and neighbour Mrs. Olive Seed, she cheerfully admits things could easily get out of hand. Five affectionate cats philosophically observe proceedings.

As councillor, she is chairman of the waterworks committee and serves as well on the finance and general purpose committee, road committee, fire and police committee and the planning and building committee because in Vaughan, councillors serve on all committees. She is also council representative with the T.T.C. and sits on the Maple Community Centre Board.

A typical day in her life begins at 7 a.m. While she feeds the family (she is a firm believer in big breakfasts) daughter Diane, 15, organizes the school lunches for Debby, 14, John, 8 1/2, and Judy, 6. She is assisted morally by Pete, who will be four in November. To save some precious time, said Mrs. McConkey, she lays out the breakfast table before she goes to bed, anywhere between 11 p.m. and one a.m.

When the children leave for school, she breakfasts. If it is a Monday she schedules her appointments for the rest of the week. Helping her in this is Mrs. Seed. The rest of the day, given over to house cleaning, is punctuated with telephone calls from people with beefs, requests for information (and even, once in a while, an encouraging word), and different township departments.

If it happens to be a Wednesday, the early morning rush is just the prelude to about 17 hours of steady activity. By the time business places are greeting the public, she is starting the first of five committee meetings at the municipal chambers and rarely gets back to the house for a quick bite before six p.m. Beside looking after normal committee work and deliberating over countless township matters, delegations have to be interviewed, listened to and each problem considered.

On Planning Board Also Delegations and individual visitors to one or another of the committees mean that, like her colleagues, she must set aside sufficient time to visit different township areas, study problems further or interview other people. Every other Tuesday evening must be given over to planning board meetings. In the process of mastering the intricacies of the waterworks department, which does a \$165,000 business per year with its nearly 3,000 consumers, the energetic councillor has leaped ditches, roved the countryside in a jeep and flown over it in a helicopter. She has scoured much of the back roads.

Bazaar chairman Mrs. E. Spears reported on what had been done and what was yet to do. All conveners gave reports and asked for assistance with their tables. The date for the bazaar is November 25. It will be held at Charles H. Howitt School. A scouting game followed the meeting.

naught Park. There are six horses, incidentally, all standard bred, three of them at home. There will be only six in January when a mare foals because by then a yearling will have been sold. But the horses, said Vaughan's lady councillor, are strictly her husband's hobby.

By the end of the year, she said, the Richvale water system will have been completed. This will serve 250 consumers, and will be known as Water Area No. 4. Area No. 1, the "front end" of Vaughan, has 2,200 consumers; Area No. 2, Maple, 600, and Estelle Subdivision, No. 3, has 10 industrial consumers.

Councillor McConkey is confident that the Langstaff Road will pay big dividends by servicing not only the C.N.R. Marshalling Yard but a number of future plants on west side of Keele Street, which has been designated industrial land. The other well brought in this year is the one at Concord. Among the headaches is the Humber Summit situation. The township has applied to North York for permission to have this area's eleven consumers hooked up to its water system. North York is willing, but has laid down prohibitive ifs and buts which, if acquiesced to by Vaughan, would cost the eleven potential consumers some \$8,000. On the face of things, this is ridiculous, she said, and negotiations continue.

Her enthusiasm for the C.N.R. Marshalling Yard and its electronic marvels has its roots in the profession of her father, the late W. O. Cudworth of Orillia. C.P.R. executive engineer. During World War II it was his duty to keep rail stock rolling uninterruptedly between Halifax and Port Arthur.

She tries to take a nap each afternoon, for one hour, but confessed this isn't always possible. And where, while a rank newcomer, she wasn't at all certain that she would have the time, ability or strength to discharge her political duties half decently, she is now much more confident and looks forward to her final 15 months as councillor with keen interest and anticipation.

Despite the endless round of council and home duties, packing lunches after picking up children after school, Ruth McConkey somehow manages to keep on looking as though she stepped from a hatbox.

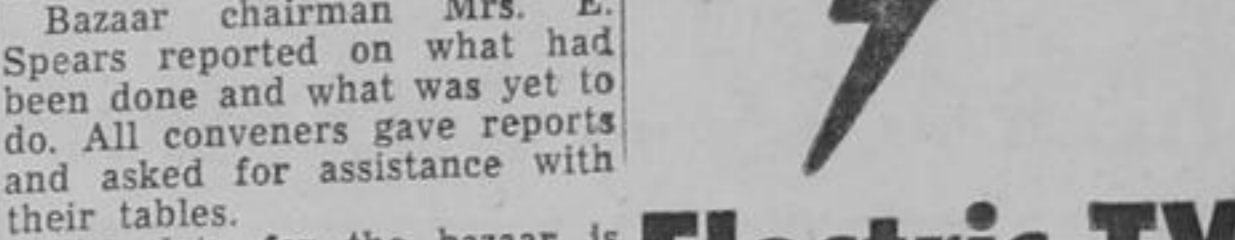
