"Just Ridiculous," Says Broadhurst Vaughan Demands Policy Statement

A letter from Vaughan Township to the town council of Richmond Hill read at Monday night's council meeting asked for a positive statement of policy regarding the provision of water and other services to the people in the Elgin Mills area of Vaughan. It was requested that Richmond Hill give this statement of policy by October 31st.

Mayor James Haggart said he had discussed with Reeve Rutherford of Vaughan the possibility of reviving the co-ordinating committee for the consideration of mutual problems. His suggestion had been favorably received and he thought the time now is ripe to get the committee working.

Councillor Tom Broadhurst declared the communication from Vaughan was not a realistic approach to the problem. He suggested a matter so involved just couldn't be resolved by an exchange of notes. "It's just ridiculous," he said, "they just want us to take a load of grief off their shoulders."

On motion of Councillor Broadhurst the Township of Vaughan will be asked to agree to the immediate set-up of the co-ordinating committee representative of both municipalities to study mutual problems, including the need for water by people in the Elgin Mills area.

The letter from Vaughan Township was as follows:

"It is apparent that numerous properties in the Township of Vaughan and adjacent to the Town of Richmond Hill are in dire need of municipal services now prevailing in the Town of Richmond Hill. Most essential at this time is an adequate supply of municipal water for the Elgin Mills area. Other municipal services, while desired by some, are not of immediate importance although their need may be anticipated in the future.

"Representation was made to the Town of Richmond Hill earlier this year for a supply of water for the ratepayers in Elgin Mills and no positive indication has been received to indicate if water will be available or not available. It has only been inferred that the supply of water for Elgin Mills will depend on the availability of water to Richmond Hill from a source as designated "Number 5 Well."

"Having regard to a report from the Medical Officer of Health for the County of York, Vaughan Township Council deems it necessary to immediately effect some measure to provide water to the Elgin Mills area. While the supply of water may be only an immediate factor to be resolved for the area adjacent to Richmond Hill, the source of supply of water for the area adjacent to your town may have a profound influence when other matters are to be resolved.

"The recent proposal from the Town of Richmond Hill to provide, at no expense to the town, a tap on the street is unrealistic and impractical. The cost involved and regulations imposed restrict and limit the benefit to be derived. This temporary arrangement, even though financed through other means and the regulations revised or modified, could not be construed as an adequate provision of water for the Elgin Mills area.

"May the Council for the Township of Vaughan have a positive statement of policy from the Council of the Town of Richmond Hill before October 31, 1961 indicating any future servicing of the area of Vaughan Township adjacent to the Town of Richmond Hill for the establishment of some compatible form of development for the area that may ultimately be annexed to Richmond Hill? It is reasonable to assume that some mutual endeavour to provide for the area adjacent to Richmond Hill would better serve the interests of all parties. The dire need of water in the Elgin Mills area now demands some immediate attention and the disposition of this matter may greatly affect numerous other factors that are pending.

Acquit Stouffville Man Steckley Death
 Floyd Houser, 28-year-old Stouffville truck driver, was acquitted Thursday of criminal negligence in the traffic death of a Gormley grandmother.

An assize jury, sitting under Mr. Justice J. L. Wilson, deliberated nearly four hours before freeing the father of four.

The jury was told Mrs. Levi Steckley, 58, was driving on Don Mills Rd. last May 4 on her way to pick up her eight-year-old granddaughter after school.

Mrs. Steckley, who had her grandson, 5, with her, stopped her car to make a left-hand turn on to 19th Ave. Her car was struck from the rear by a tractor-trailer drawing gravel, court was told.

Mrs. Steckley was killed instantly and her grandson received injuries which put him in hospital for three days.

1st Beverley Acres Scout Troop
 With excellent attendance, the 1st Beverley Acres Scout Troop held their regular meeting on Tuesday night under the leadership of Scoutmaster Norm Foster. Instructions, training and tests were given, with particular stress on the St. John Ambulance first aid training course.

Cancel Meeting For School Bus Jefferson Area
 A proposed meeting which would see members of the Vaughan Area School Board, Vaughan Township Council and parents of Jefferson school children consulting on the bus problem will not be held, Mrs. T. J. Thomasson, leader of the Jefferson parents, told "The Liberal" on Tuesday.

Following cancellation of the bus which had transported children to Jefferson School for a number of years, even though they lived inside the two-mile distance from the school, this year, parents went on strike, refusing to have their children walk on hazardous Yonge St. The strike continued until Radio Station CHUM volunteered to pay for a bus for the youngsters.

The first month of the arrangement has ended and no decision has been made as to what happens next, said Mrs. Thomasson. She did not know whether CHUM would continue the arrangement. Reason for the cancellation at the three-day meeting given to her by Vaughan officials, she said, was that members of council felt that it was "not auspicious" to have a joint meeting. She said that councillors felt that the school board was directly in charge of the situation, legally.

A lawyer acting for the Jefferson parents would now get a written statement from the Vaughan Township School Area Board and would then advise parents what action to take, said Mrs. Thomasson.
