The appointment of Mrs. P. D. McTaggart-Cowan of Thornhill as commissioner for York Central Division, Girl Guides of Canada, was announced at a meeting of the division council held on October 12th. Mrs. McTaggart-Cowan has been district commissioner of Thornhill for the last three years and now succeeds Mrs. H. D. Currie who has been division commissioner for the past six years.

Three new district commissioners were introduced at this meeting. Mrs. D. R. Moore, formerly lieutenant of the 2nd Thornhill Guide Company succeeds Mrs. McTaggart-Cowan in Thornhill district. Mrs. F. A. Royal Sea Rangers, Toronto, succeeds Mrs. F. Bigley in Richvale district. Mrs. William Yeo, formerly Captain of the 1st Richmond Hill Guide Company, succeeds Mrs. Hugh Yerex in Richmond Hill West district. Mrs. Bigley and Mrs. Yerex are retiring after four and three years service respectively. Mrs. Philip Rumney of Victoria Square, having retired from the appointment of camp adviser for the division, was presented with a gift in appreciation of the splendid service given in this office during the past nine years. She is succeeded by Mrs. D. C. Inglis, a guider from Richmond Hill East district.

**Richmond Hill Town Council Briefs**

Richmond Hill Town Council spent four hours on Monday evening discussing municipal business. Among items discussed, in addition to those reported elsewhere in this issue, were the following:

Council concurred in a request from the Industrial Commission for a survey of the Newkirk industrial park. The Jaycees were granted permission to erect a sign on town property promoting their annual auction on December 1st. Council agreed to hear, at a future meeting, R. B. Bradley, a representative of the Housing Branch of the Ontario Dept. of Commerce and Development on the subject of public housing. E. P. Leno complained that a resident of Pleasantville was carrying on business at a private residence. No action was taken by council.

J. E. Teetzel wrote to say he could not seriously consider an offer made by the town for his property on Cedar Avenue. In fact, he said, "the offer was facetious" or "possibly just plain insulting." On motion of Deputy-reeve Bradstock, council decided to take steps to expropriate the property. On motion of Councillor Mrs. Margaret Southwell a grant of \$10. was made to the John Howard Society of Ontario. Council said "No" to a suggestion of Whitby council that speed limit in school zones be 15 miles per hour instead of 25 as at present. "Ridiculous, it just wouldn't be enforceable," said Councillor Broadhurst.
