The present open season is being conducted on an experimental basis for the purpose of providing additional hunting facilities for the public and extending the recreational uses of a suitable area being a provincial park. Hunters are being asked to supply department staff with information and data when leaving the hunting area, which will be of value in developing further management programmes.
