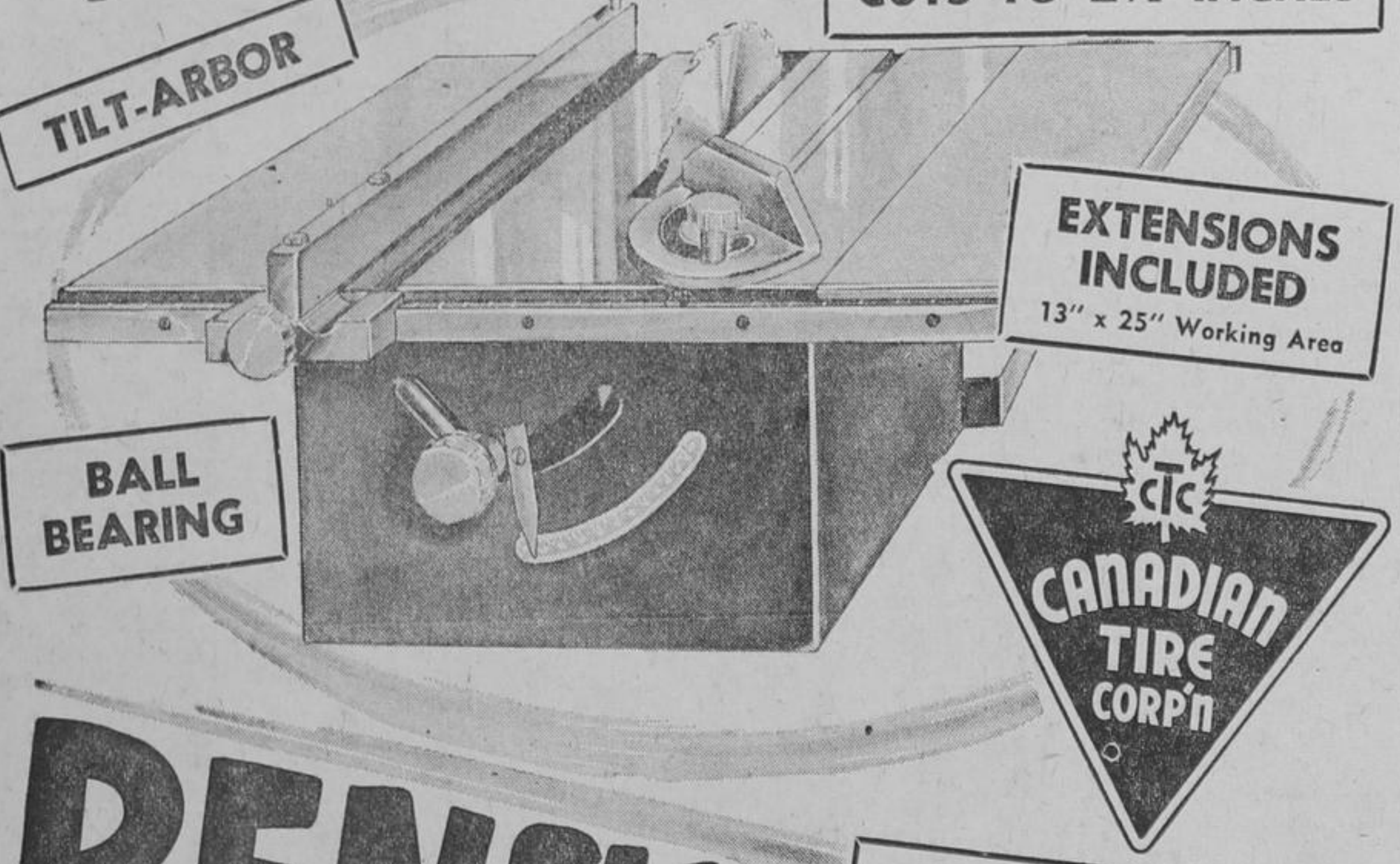


Broadhurst Says Citizens Service Deserves Honour

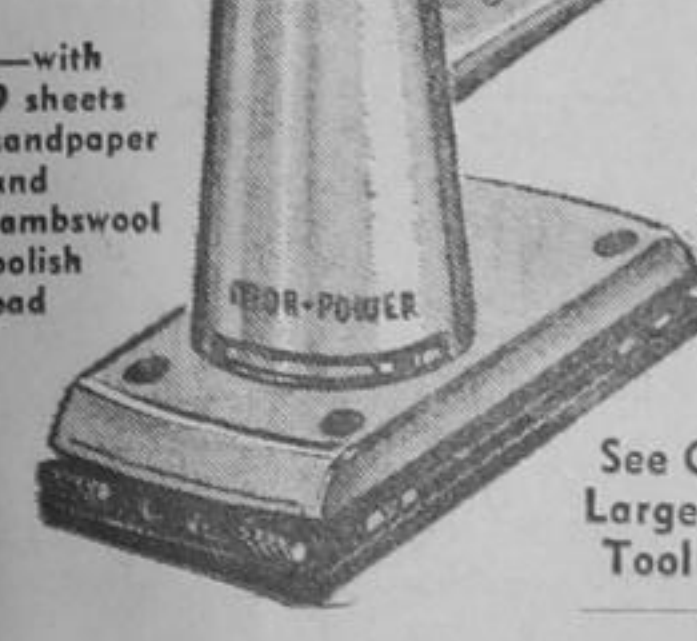

Postal Delivery For Elgin Mills Planned For '62

Numbering of houses in part of Elgin Mills, preceding the setting up of door to door postal delivery, has been authorized by Vaughan Township Council, as reported in last week's "Liberal."

Actual start of such delivery is not likely to take place before next spring at the earliest, says Postmaster T. Willis of Richmond Hill. Surveys have to be made, even after numbering has been completed, and rearrangement of routes has to be looked after.

Since the Elgin Mills post office was closed some weeks ago local residents have been getting their mail through groups of boxes. The system has worked well, says Mr. Willis, and not a single complaint has been received.

Christmas mail has already started to flow through the local office, says the postmaster. A small volume of overseas material has been cleared.

Henderson Extension Approved By Markham

A long-standing problem was settled at a recent meeting of Markham Township Council when Robert Jackson was given authority to go ahead with an extension of Henderson Avenue to take it through to John Street, Thornhill. By an arrangement with council Mr. Jackson will establish a paved road, complete with services. In return, council will forgo the usual lot fees. The extension is approximately 750 feet in length.

The land which the road will occupy will be deeded to the township which will take over the road in the usual course, when approved.

No Particulars Given As Big Accounts Paid

Payment of insurance on municipal property amounting to \$11,399 was authorized by Vaughan Township Council on recommendation of the finance and general purpose committee. Part of the sum is for three-year premiums and part for one year. Insurance is divided among agents, said Township Clerk-Treasurer James M. McDonald, although no particulars were given.

Council also authorized payment of \$3,460 for welfare, where it is not the practice to divulge names in deference to the feelings of individuals. Payments of \$24,594 on general accounts were authorized, again without particulars being given.

Vaughan May Instal Mains

Water For Elgin Mills Said Under Discussion

Reeve F. R. Perkins, chairman of Richmond Hill Council works committee, reported a meeting with Vaughan council relative to the proposed supply of water to the people in the Elgin Mills area, where dry wells are causing much hardship, at this week's council meeting.

Progress is being made on an agreement for Richmond Hill to supply a minimum of 75,000 gallons a day. The suggestion under consideration is that Vaughan will construct the necessary water-mains to give service to some 150 homes. Richmond Hill committee will continue study of the proposal and will submit details of a rate structure.

Mayor Haggart warned the committee that it must consider the possible effect on Richmond Hill taxpayers could the provision of water lead to more development and home building in the Vaughan area, which is part of the Richmond Hill school section.

On motion of Reeve Perkins, tender for winter sand was awarded to Gormley Sand and Gravel and for snowplowing to Street Construction.

Free Water
Council decided to continue for this year supplying water free to the Arena Commission. A bill submitted by the water-works dept. for the first three weeks of the season's operation amounted to \$200, and it was said this came as a shock to the commission, which in the past received water free. A letter from the commission asked council to defer water charges until next season. Council members were sympathetic to the request but felt they could take action for only this year. What

Royal Bank To Open At Keele St., No. 7

The Royal Bank of Canada is to open a branch in a temporary building at the corner of Keele Street and No. 7 Highway, on property belonging to the Canadian National Railways. Application was made to Vaughan Township Council for permission to erect a temporary building. Councillors disapproved briefly, suggesting that room was available in the Conservation Building in the same general neighbourhood.

The bank said that the location suggested was more advantageous and also that it was likely that a permanent office would be opened if the neighbourhood developed. Council finally approved, on the understanding that the bank would erect a permanent building later, if business warranted it.
