### Serious Crimes Are Increasing Committee Says

"This shows the more serious nature of some crimes that are on the increase in the County of York," said county council's police committee, making its report to the full council. It pointed out that there were more cases in higher courts this year as evidence of the increase in major crimes.

All phases of police work had increased, declared the committee, with a great deal of time being spent in major crime investigations. That increase was general in all departments, it was said. Finger-printing and photography, for instance, was up considerably.

Policing of courts by the county's security guard had also increased greatly. A further problem along these lines would come into existence with the opening of a court in Richmond Hill. A solution was being sought.

A former reeve and council member of Vaughan Township, James H. Robson celebrated his 80th birthday on November 24, at his home on the 7th concession, Vaughan.

Gathered around him were 30 members of his family including his sons Frank, Bert and Charlie and his daughter, Jean (Mrs. Roy Bowen), who all live nearby and daughters Helen (Mrs. Wes Obelman) of Lemberg, Sask., and Marion (Mrs. Ray McDougall), of Calgary, Alberta and several friends.

Mr. Robson was born in the Purpleville Area, Vaughan Township and at the age of 15 moved to the farm, with his family, on the 7th concession opposite the Purpleville School where he still lives today and is the only original resident still living in that neighborhood.

He farmed the 350 acres in mixed farming and in 1911 he tore down the original buildings that were made of logs and reused the materials to build a larger barn. In 1926, he built the present house.

Always active in the community Mr. Robson was a member of the local school board until 1921 when he ran for council and was a councillor from 1924 to 1929. In 1930 he was elected reeve. On the completion of 25 years of service to the Township of Vaughan, he was presented with a gold headed cane.


He is a mason and immediate past president of the Woodbridge Fair Board.

### LOW COST TRANSPORTATION

In a New York junkyard of old cars not so long back, a man with a sharp eye for antique autos found a delapidated hulk that appeared to be of European vintage.

He paid the unsuspecting junk dealer \$350 for it — and thereby got the world's rarest and most valuable classic car. It was a Bugatti Royale, made around 1927 by a strange feudal sort of auto maker M. R. Bear in French Alsace-Lorraine.

Every piece of the intricate, 130 mile-an-hour beauty was hand made and to antique car collectors the \$350 junk was priceless. It is to car collectors what a rare stamp is to stamp collectors.

Originally the car cost \$40,000 — for the engine and chassis, and King Alfonso of Spain, its original owner, paid extra for the coachwork.

This car, in the language of car dealers, was a "clunker". Most dealers run across clunkers now and then, although few ever have the thrill, or the misfortune, to acquire a hidden gem like the Bugatti Royale.

But the "as is" car can be a godsend for the man with a little mechanical knack, or the time and interest to repair it. An old car though, is a problem for the car dealer — he knows that the car is basically sound, but the price it would bring even in top shape isn't worth turning skilled mechanics loose on it.
