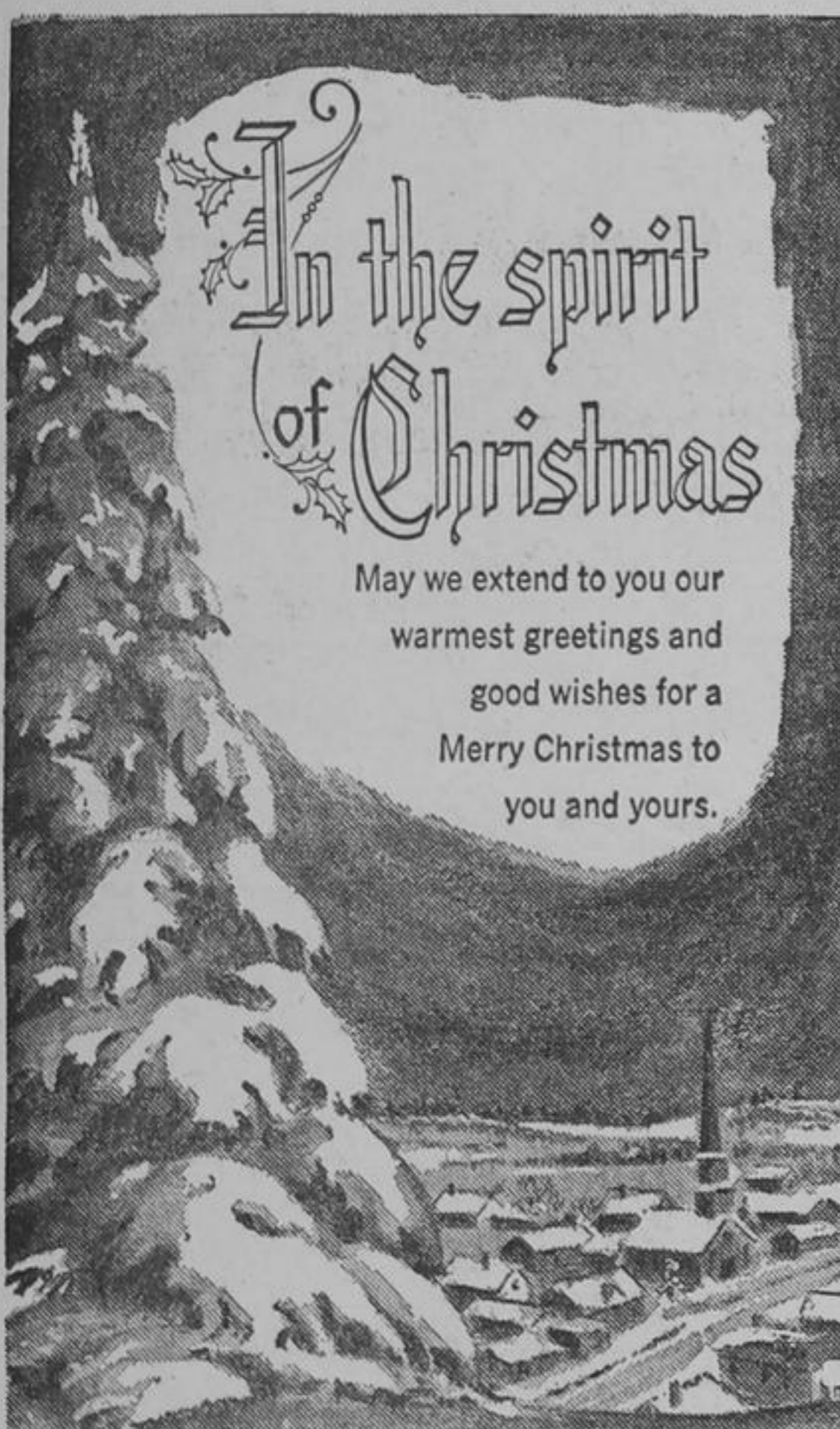

Miss Margaret Sande underwent a tonsillectomy at York County Hospital last week.

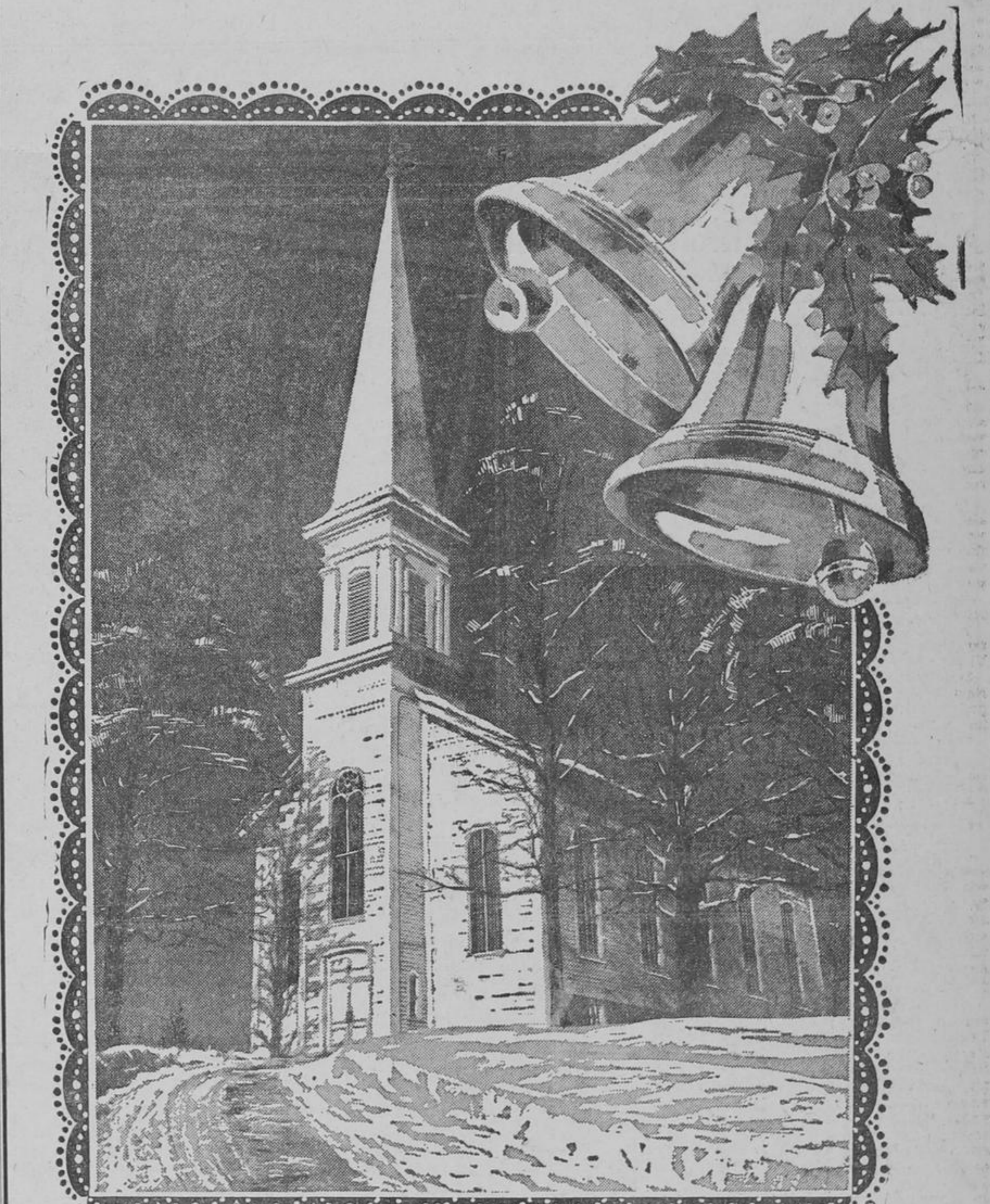
