County Council Debates High School Appointments

Inconsistencies Revealed As Trustees Named

York County Council members nearly found themselves in a contradictory position last week when they debated the question as to whether all school trustees should be elected. A considerable amount of confusion existed until it was pointed out that all trustees except high school ones were elected - therefore the debate obviously hinged on the question of high school trustees and the method of naming them to office.

Opinions were sharply divided. Deputy Reeve Caroline Ion felt that the system of appointment of high school trustees should be continued whereas Deputy Reeve Caroline Ion of the same municipality made one of the strongest speeches of the debate in favouring election of all trustees at all levels.

Deputy Reeve R. G. Henderson of Woodbridge said that many councils were concerned over the fact that they had no control over spending bodies. He felt that there would be much more interest in school management if their management was closer to the people.

Reeve Floyd Perkins of Richmond Hill was strongly in favour of election of trustees, as was Deputy Reeve John Bradstock. Reeve Perkins said that if the principle that councils and public school boards should be elected was right, then it was equally right that high school trustees should be elected also. He said that the claim that "better" people could be found for high school boards if they did not have to run was fundamentally wrong. He questioned why such a statement did not apply to other bodies such as councils and public school boards.

Reeve Clarence Davis of Aurora agreed that if taxpayers' money was being spent there should be responsibility to taxpayers - yet voted against election of trustees when the question was put. Deputy Reeve John Bradstock of Richmond Hill felt that, with the large portion of the tax dollar being spent by high school trustees, they should be elected. Deputy Reeve Roy Pollock of North Gwillimbury, felt against election of trustees, while that much more thought should be given to the persons elected.

Members of high school boards were handicapped, said Reeve Albert Rutherford of Vaughan Township. They had one of the biggest problems in the province in dealing with the snow.

On December 9 a sudden snow squall brought six accidents in 2 1/2 hours. With only three men ordinarily on duty at one time, this meant that off duty officers had to be called in from their homes to help handle the situation.

At 1:30 p.m. on Saturday, a Richmond Hill Police officer Const. Fuelling, who lives at Gormley, was driving south on Don Mills Road when his car went out of control near the Buttonville bridge, hit a guard post, and did considerable damage. P. C. Dukes investigated.

At 1:50 p.m. of the same day, Mrs. Rita Wilson of Whitechurch Township was driving south at the same point when her car went out of control and skidded into the wall of Stephenson's Mill. Mrs. Wilson suffered back injuries. Five hundred dollars damages to her station wagon resulted. Const. Barry McWhirter investigated.

At 2:10 Const. McWhirter attended another accident at Gormley, on the Don Mills Road, when a vehicle driven by Wm. Miller of Castle Frank Road, Toronto, went out of control due to slippery conditions. Mr. Miller suffered head and back injuries, and his passenger, Mrs. Ethel Oakley sustained head injuries. Both were taken to Branson Hospital. Damage to the car was \$1,000.00.

An accident at a narrow bridge near the Anglican Church in Unionville occurred at 2:10 p.m. when cars driven by John C. Fiegehen of Bragdale Road, Don Mills, and Fred Zeagler of Unionville collided.

At 2:15 p.m. Const. Dukes investigated an accident at Don Mills Road and No. 7 Highway, when a south bound car driven by Dennis G. Large of Rockport Crescent, Richmond Hill, went out of control and broke off a sign post.

Another car went out of control as it rounded the Don Mills curve at the Gormley Road, Bernard Leader of Newmarket, was northbound when the accident occurred. P. C. Kelly investigated, at 4:00 p.m.

December 11, Sgt. Shearn was called to a three-vehicle collision in which no one was injured, but more than \$1,000.00 damage was done to two trucks and a new Oldsmobile sedan. This accident occurred 1/2 mile south of fourteenth Avenue on Don Mills Road. Trucks involved were a milk transport driven by Earl Anderson of Clarendon (\$600.00 damage), a truck driven by George Gaidos of Johnstown Avenue, Willowdale \$350.00 damage, and the car was driven by John W. Rhodes, Midland Avenue, Scarborough (\$400.00 damage).

December 14, a car driven by Mrs. Samena D. Sissons and a truck driven by Ross Greener of Pickering, sideswiped each other at a narrow bridge near Cedar Brae Golf Club on Steeles Avenue, P. C. Kelly investigated. There were no injuries, but \$525.00 damages resulted.

Expenditure on the home ran \$36,216.18 over the original estimates, county council was told. This was due to the flooding situation and, as well, land acquisition, sewer connections, water main installation and other features which ran over the original budget. Total amount spent on the home was \$1,266,417.18.

Councillors then proceeded to vote for a number of county council nominees for high school boards, most of them completely unknown to the men who were voting on them. The county council - a nomination secret of the opposition to elected members of county council started making nominations of trustees for appointments.

When put to a vote, those favouring election of high school trustees in preference to their appointment lost.

Reeve Floyd Perkins of Richmond Hill was consistent. He voted in favour of election of trustees rather than appointment, but was forced by conditions of county council for the York Central District High School Board. He named Thomas Pitt of 427 Crosby Avenue to replace Trustee Mrs. Barbara Langstaff who, he said, had indicated to him that she did not wish to be reappointed.

Inconsistency of the whole situation of naming trustees was revealed by the fact that Mr. Pitt had, at town council meeting a short time earlier, been nominated by Reeve Perkins as a representative on the high school board, to be named by town council. Another person had also been nominated and at a later meeting, town council would have had to vote on the two men, plus others who might have been nominated in the

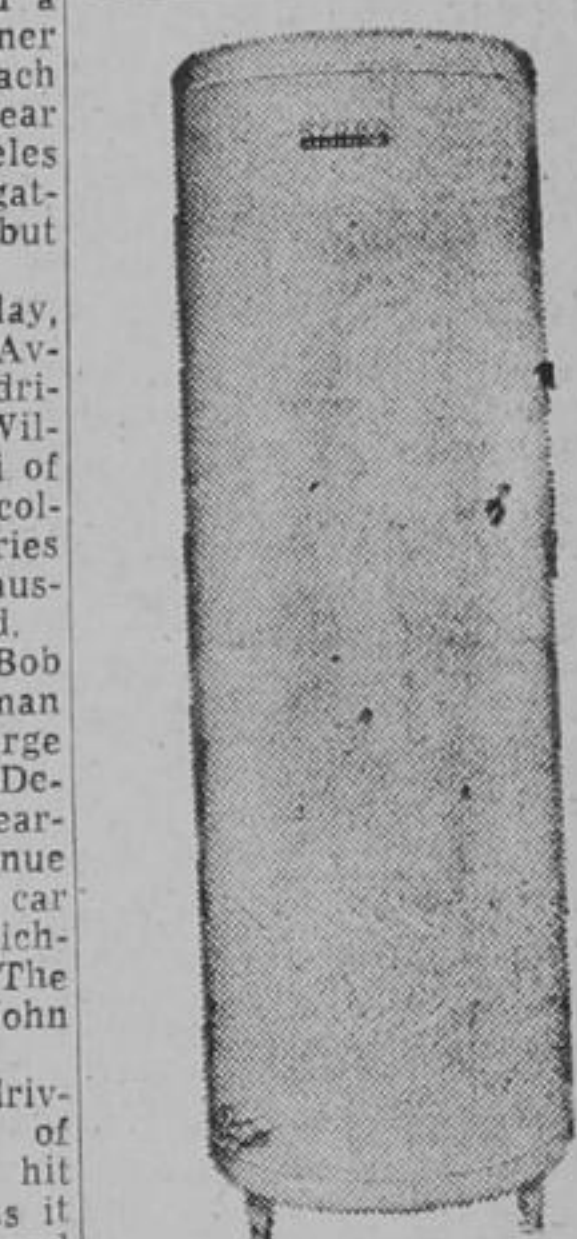
