Will Repeat Classes On Parent Education At Walter Scott P. S.

A parent education discussion series under the sponsorship of Water Scott Y.W.C.A. is being made available to all parents in Richmond Hill and district. Child guidance will be the main feature of the discussions which will be held every Thursday beginning February 8 and continuing to March 22 at Walter Scott Public School. Conducting the course will be Mrs. G.C.V. Hewson, a graduate of the Institute of Child Study and also a contributor to a "Tips for Parents" column in a Toronto daily paper. Mrs. Hewson conducted last year's parent education discussion series. She has indicated that she will be willing to discuss privately any individual points of concern, after each meeting. In order to facilitate early completion of details advance registration is necessary. Classes are limited to 30 people. Will Continue Bearing Down On Strays And Owners

Rabies Cases Appear In Markham Control Officer Stresses Danger

Two dogs with positive rabies have been found recently in Markham Township, Canine Control Officer James Ryan has told "The Liberal". Both were on the Fifth Concession and comparatively near to each other, indicating that infection may have come from the same basic source. The dogs had not bitten any human being, although a man who handled one of them is being given the Pasteur treatment. One dog became ill and was sent to the veterinary. It died after two days. Two tests were made, with the second one indicating positive rabies. The other died at home and again a test after death showed positive rabies. There was no visible sign of either animal having been bitten. But, said Mr. Ryan, this did not mean much as the bite from an infected skunk—now believed to be a source of danger—might not be seen easily. In addition to skunks, foxes, are regarded as possible carriers. Recently a raccoon has been found to have rabies. Cattle Quarantined In Buttonville, said the canine control officer, a cow stepped on a dying skunk, which was found to have rabies. The entire herd was quarantined. Rabies could show up in many ways, he said, and there was no

foundation in the belief that animals infected became violent immediately. This might happen in the last stages only, with the animals, as in the case of the Markham Township dogs, becoming ill first. Ryan advises that any animal showing symptoms of unexplainable illness should be examined by a veterinarian at once. Cats, he warned, could also be carriers. The rabies situation was becoming worse, he believed. There was now evidence of the disease on both sides of Richmond Hill in Vaughan and Markham Townships. He had no confirmation of rabies in Markham before. Control of animals was vital, Mr. Ryan said. "Don't let animals loose. You don't know what happens to them," he said. "Maybe some of the public think this is a game," he said. "If it is, it's a very serious game. It involves human life," he asserted, as he said that he was determined to carry on his present policy of summoning all owners who let dogs run at large. Whenever possible he was picking up stray dogs, he said. He reiterated his lack of desire to "persecute" animal owners. "I'm only doing it for their own protection," he said, "particularly that of their children."

Yonge St. Block Is Locality Of Midnight Blaze

Fire of unknown origin, said to have started in paper on a desk in the premises of Magwood Associates Ltd. on the second floor, caused considerable damage to the building at 70 Yonge Street South, Richmond Hill. Beside the Magwood company, the building houses the David McLean real estate office, Speed Equipment Distributors Ltd. and apartments. The fire was discovered at 12.30 a.m. on January 28th by William Neal, former Mayor, whose car sales building and residence are on the other side of Yonge Street, and who saw smoke coming from under the eaves. Damage to the building was estimated at \$3,500 by Fire Chief Alfred Stong. Principal damage was in the quarters of Magwood Associates where, said G. J. Palmer, proprietor, stock valued at \$20,000 was stored. His loss would be heavy, he said, as while materials were insured their nature would cause a sales delay. Equipment in stock was for aircraft and electronic use and would have to be re-examined and its condition certified before it could be sold. This would take several weeks. Water and smoke damage were caused to the real estate office and to an apartment in rear of the second floor where the occupants, the H. Sykes family, had been away for some time.

11,000 Lb. Overload Brings Maximum Fine

A tractor-trailer overloaded by 11,000 pounds resulted in a \$50 fine for Danny Zappuigna, its driver, in Richmond Hill Magistrate's Court last Friday.
