Drinking In Pit Draws Fines For Woodbridge Lads
Six Woodbridge area boys, five of them under the age of 21, were fined a total of \$85 plus costs in Richmond Hill Magistrate's Court last Thursday. Paul Budd, Denis McQuoid, Robert Moore, John Findley and Frank Ball were all charged with consuming while under age and also with consuming in a place other than their residences. Another man, Ernest Finley, 22, was charged with supplying liquor to persons under the age of 21 as well as consuming in a place other than his residence.

The offences occurred February 2 in the Connor gravel pit on Elders Mills Road, a continuation of the Langstaff Road. The particular area has been under constant surveillance by Vaughan Township Police as a result of complaints received by residents of the area. Tractor tires are said to have been slashed with broken beer bottles and other willful damage caused by drinking parties in the pit and surrounding area. One of the offenders, Frank Ball, had a fine of \$25 plus costs imposed because it was his second offence. The remainder of the accused were appearing on first offences.

Two Businesses Move Extension Of Yonge Street Building Forecast As Older Property Is Sold

The Herridge Electric Shop, formerly located on Yonge Street North opposite Richmond Hill Municipal Building, is moving to 40 Leventdale, where a shop is being redecorated and enlarged window space provided. The move comes about because of the sale of the present premises to the Sam Sorbara real estate interests. The deal will also force the movement of Bob's Smoke Shop, located in the same building as the Herridge business.

The building, one of the oldest on Yonge Street, stands between the north end of the present Sorbara store and office building which is set back some distance from the highway, and Yonge Street.

Purchase of the building in which the Hillcrest Beauty Salon was located at 39 Yonge Street North, was reported some time ago. Its proprietor, George Potter, moved to Peterborough.

Percy Coe told members the hockey rink on the school grounds is being well cared for under the direction of Tom Ormesher and his work teams. Thanks were extended to Hughes Shell Station for donating time and a mechanical scraper last Saturday morning for the purpose of clearing the rink.

Joe Samson informed members a parish draw is to be run with proceeds going towards the building of the church. Members wishing to contribute time should call Joe Samson or his committee.

Pat Killeau commented on the sudden death of Rev. Father Enright and thanked members for their presence at the funeral home and the high mass.

Rev. Father Robinson spoke to the members concerning the discipline of their children. He mentioned the fact mothers are busy most of the day and sometimes into the evening. The fathers on their arrival home should take the responsibility in respect to the child's daily behavior. If the child requires punishment the husband should assist his wife by taking the necessary action, he said.

History Given

Col. F. J. Picking, news editor of "The Liberal", was the guest speaker. His subject is "The History of Richmond Hill". To understand fully the history of Richmond Hill, Col. Picking went back to 1700 in Germany. At this time a group of Mennonites from the Upper Rhine, being persecuted for their religious beliefs set out for Pennsylvania. On their arrival, similar religious persecution existed and they started on the long journey which carried them to Markham Township.

To add to this settlement, in 1794 a brigade of batteaux arrived in Toronto Bay, bringing 64 German families, together with livestock, supplies, implements and equipment for a saw and grist mill. They finally settled in Markham Township in a place that still bears the name German Mills.

Eventually troubles were many, debt, lack of supplies. The flour mill failed. This led to the ruin of the settlement but even in failure some of the settlers remained.

In 1802 another settlement began. They came by wagon train from Pennsylvania travelling a trail 450 miles long and taking eight weeks to complete the journey. This settlement with its members fighting every inch of the way settled and remained. In York County today the Pennsylvania Dutch continue their farming and their continuing influence can be seen on Markham Township. These are the men who founded the land we call home.

Miles Hill First

Col. Picking informed the members that Richmond Hill was first called Miles Hill, after one of the first residents and later the name was changed to Mount Pleasant.

To commemorate a visit by the Governor General, the Duke of Richmond, in 1819, the name
