TOWNSHIP OF MARKHAM PLANNING BOARD OFFICIAL PLAN AMENDMENT NO. 23
 A Public Meeting of the Township of Markham Planning Board will be held at 8 p.m. on Thursday, March 29th, 1962, at the Thornhill High School, to explain to interested ratepayers the provisions of proposed Amendment No. 23 to the Official Plan of the Municipality. This meeting will deal primarily with those aspects of the Amendment affecting residents and landowners in the urban areas of the municipality e.g. Concession 1, and those areas of Concessions 2, 3 and 4 lying south of No. 7 Highway.
 The first Official Plan of the Municipality was instituted in 1955. This Plan has been reviewed by the Planning Board and a revised Official Plan has been prepared. Amendment No. 23 constitutes this proposed revised Official Plan, and as such, affects the whole of the Township of Markham Planning Area.
 Copies of the text and maps of Amendment No. 23 to the Official Plan are available for inspection at the Municipal Offices, Buttonville, during office hours.

Federal Government Approves On A \$140,131 Loan To Newmarket
 The Federal Government has approved a loan of \$140,131 to the Town of Newmarket, to assist in the construction of a sewage treatment project.
 The announcement was made today by C. A. Cathers, M.P., for York North.
 Made under Part VI-B of the National Housing Act, the loan is for a term of 30 years with interest at 5 1/2 per cent per annum. The loan is based on an estimated cost of \$249,625.
 The Town of Newmarket together with a populated area of the Township of East Gwillimbury on the town's north boundary is located astride the Holland River. The area is partly served by scattered individual sewers which discharge into the Holland River. The two communities propose to join in the construction of an interceptor sewer which will run parallel to the Holland River and terminate in the treatment plant. The NHA loan to Newmarket will assist in the construction of approximately 14,267 lineal feet of interceptor sewer ranging from 10 to 30 inches in diameter.
 Under Part VI-B of the National Housing Act, Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation may make a loan to a municipality or to a municipal sewerage corporation for the purpose of assisting in the construction or expansion of a sewage treatment project. A project must be part of an overall plan for the elimination or prevention of water and soil pollution.
