Trailways Of Canada Started With Two Taxis

Half Million Miles Run Annually By Busses Of Richmond Hill Firm

On April 9th Trailways of Canada, a locally based, privately-owned concern, will start operations on its newest bus line - Bathurst Street between Elgin Mills Road and downtown Toronto. In its own right the start of this line is a big step forward, extending travel facilities to residents on the west side of Richmond Hill and points south, but for Trailways of Canada it is merely another step. This doesn't mean that the Bathurst line won't be just as important to the firm as the rest of its extensive travel service, it's just that Trailways have been taking big steps forward since original transportation services were started in Newmarket back in 1942.

What is now known as Trailways of Canada had its beginning in a two-car taxi stand at the King George Hotel in Newmarket. Larry Needler, now president of Trailways, and another man set up a partnership and shared all duties involved in running their new concern. Through the years the business steadily expanded until, in 1946, the fleet had been built up to eight cars, all radio equipped. Two years later the firm boasted a fleet of 12 cars requiring a staff of 12 people. The company's first major expansion came in 1948 when the partners decided to branch into bus service. The firm, now sporting the name Newmarket Taxi and Bus Lines acquired two ten-year-old Ford busses and started a local service. The new bus service, on top of the still-expanding taxi business, necessitated the renting of garage facilities.

In 1949, Newmarket Taxi and Bus Lines received a contract from Newmarket High School to transport about 50 students per day. Because of the contract the company found it necessary to buy another bus, the firm's first brand new one. The following year the company got another school contract which made it necessary to buy another new bus. By this time the staff had increased to 14. In 1951 the firm started its expansion out of the town and into the surrounding territory with the acquisition of an existing bus line between Mount Albert and Newmarket. This operation included charter privileges which meant that the company could charter out of Newmarket. This run is still in existence.

The next year, the firm had to get three more busses because all Newmarket High School transportation was now handled by Newmarket Taxi and Bus Lines. That December Mr. Needler took over the complete operation of the bus lines and his partner carried on with the taxi business. In 1953, Newmarket Coach Lines came into being with a total of six busses operating. The firm rented garage facilities, but these were found to be too small and on occasion it was necessary to have a trailer to carry out extensive repairs outside in the middle of the winter. The firm's own garage was built during the summer of 1954 on Davis Drive in Newmarket because of the need for more space and better facilities.

The same year, Newmarket Coach Lines bought a used charter bus to carry the load of the expanding charter work and in 1955 the first new "highway coach", also used for charter work, was purchased. In 1956 the coach lines made application to establish a bus route on the east side of Richmond Hill to serve the new development that had begun to crop up there. The route runs into Toronto. As proof that part of Bayview Avenue's recent condition has prevailed for some time, Mr. Needler remembers that someone remarked at the hearing, held prior to the approval of the new run, that the proposed bus run would probably be a success as long as the vehicles were equipped with seat belts to hold passengers in their seats while on Bayview Avenue. The new route was finally approved and on April 9, almost five years ago to the day, the first Bayview Avenue run was made. Although the first day's fare was not too promising only 18 people all day. Trailway busses now make 13 return trips per day, requiring seven vehicles.

On July 1, 1958, a local bus service was started in Richmond Hill, and as a result the local run in Newmarket was discontinued. The Town of Richmond Hill subsidizes the local operation.
