Two People Injured In Mishap

Two young motorcycleists were injured Sunday when the machine they were riding struck a car at the intersection of Kennedy Road and Highway 7 in Markham Township. The car, after being struck by the machine, went out of control and hit two other cars causing about \$800 damage.
Injured were Douglas Smith and his wife Beverly of 104 18th Street, Toronto. They were riding with three other cyclists when a car driven by Mikko Kiiskinen of 38 Sussex Avenue, Toronto, pulled into the intersection into their path. The impact of the crash sent Douglas Smith, thrown from the machine, struck a car driven by Giuseppe Leo of 130 Major Avenue, Toronto, bounced off it and hit the Kiiskinen vehicle, then hit the Leo car again. The Kiiskinen car went out of control and careened into the Leo vehicle and also another driven by Morley Rankin of 271 Salem Avenue, Toronto.
Mr. Smith received cuts to his knees and legs and his wife suffered cuts to her forehead, a broken ankle and bruises. The bike, a '53 Harley, received about \$250 damage.
Kiiskinen has been charged with careless driving and will appear in Willowdale court May 17.
Damage amounting to about \$500 resulted from an accident on Bayview Avenue near Highway 7.

Warning Phones Are Removed As Sirens Readied

Richmond Hill, Maple and Markham Police Departments have lost their RED telephones. Nobody, apparently, is grumbling about suspected favouritism, with Newmarket's department retaining the one installed there.
The telephones were installed in an interim means of giving warning to those municipalities in which road warning sirens are installed. The Phase One siren system is now complete and control circuits to activate these sirens have been grounded by counties. All sirens would be sounded, when required, from one central location, therefore the necessity for the special telephones has disappeared.
Points where the sirens still have to be manually activated retain their RED telephones. Twelve telephones are being retained in the province-wide RED system of warning and seventeen are being removed.

Oak Ridges Is Centre Of O. P. P. Attention

A special O.P.P. traffic squad has been centering its attention on the Oak Ridges area for the past few week-day mornings. The squad, mainly interested in curbing speeders, was sent into the area at the request of the O.P.P. detachment at Bond Lake, as a result of complaints that speeders were passing through the area when children were on their way to school in the morning. Although the squad was brought into the area on a request, it is not unusual for this special traffic group, which covers a great deal of southern Ontario, to appear in any area despite the fact that area is probably covered by a provincial police detachment.
The squad has had as many as three cars in the Oak Ridges area at one time this week but there is no indication how many speeders have been tagged.

Spring Clean-up Now Big Problem For Works Dept.

Spring cleaning, a problem for most housewives, is a double-barrelled one for Richmond Hill's works department. The works department is concerned with throwing out the accumulation of odds and ends — the works department has to pick it up and then dispose of it elsewhere.
Reeve Floyd Perkins, works committee chairman and Works Commissioner Otto Whalen visited Vaughan Township recently, asking aid in finding a spot for disposal. Reeve Perkins told town council meeting this week their request will be considered.
Disposal of refuse in Richmond Hill has become a major job. It has to be sorted and then carted to a dump near Aurora. town council was told. This is a costly process. It was estimated that if it could be disposed of in Vaughan a considerable amount could be saved. Local spots where refuse could be used for fill were used up.
A recent tour of the town disclosed a huge amount of material being placed outside for pick-up, the reeve and works commissioner declared. At one house there were thirty hampers. The works department yard was choked every week when material was brought in, and burning of it was also creating a nuisance.
