Past Due Taxes Liquidation Is Still Climbing

Over \$20,000 more has been paid in past due taxes this year than in the same period last year, said Richmond Hill's assessor, R. W. Johnson this week. Results, he intimated, were due to the publicity which had been given to the town council's determination to clean up the situation and to letters which had been sent to taxpayers in arrears on April 2. Past due taxes at the end of 1961 amounted to \$206,150. Up to the end of March 538,476 had been paid. During April, up to the 12th, approximately another \$8,000 had come in. Other amounts were being received daily and it was anticipated that by the end of the month a considerable additional amount would have been liquidated. A number of persons had called regarding their intentions, said Mr. Johnson, who has added the job of collecting these taxes to his normal duties as assessment commissioner. He reiterated his appeal to those in arrears to call at the town offices and discuss their problems with officials. Unless arrangements are made in connection with overdue taxes, accounts for which taxes are to be handed to the bailiff and accounts for property taxes will be registered as liens against the property involved.
