(Continued from 1) cocktail bars and private membership lounges. In Etobicoke now thirteen licenses for liquor outlets have already been approved, although they voted only last year, and the yes vote was carried only on a recount early in 1962. Mr. Scudis further stated that he believes in common with the other members of the "Vote No" Committee that such licensed premises would be undesirable for our town. He therefore urged all citizens to go out and vote "No" on Saturday.

Mr. Kerslake then introduced the guest speaker of the evening, Mr. Warren Baillie of Concord, as a fellow citizen of this area, a man active in home and school associations, in community work, and in the Township of Vaughan, and instrumental in securing a "No" decision in Vaughan in their last plebiscite on the issue.

Mr. Baillie spoke of his interest in Richmond Hill as a close neighbour, and the high regard he had always had for the town and particularly for its business men. He spoke some words of encouragement to the workers on the local committee, urging the importance of work right up to the closing of the polls on Saturday. He quoted figures which suggested that as a business proposition for the town the proposal before us would bring no advantage to the town's citizens. He also expressed the view that the real
