A major advance in attempts to cure cancer with chemistry was achieved by Canadian research workers who discovered in the periwinkle plant an ingredient called vinaleukoblastine, or VLB. The discovery was made while trying unsuccessfully to verify a Jamaican folk-lore belief that tea made with the leaves of the plant was effective against diabetes. VLB has been found effective in delaying the advance of certain kinds of cancer. It is still under investigation


