Plan School For Rural Ministers At O. A. C.
A committee of rural ministers met this week to plan for the 13th annual school for rural clergymen which is to be held at the Ontario Agricultural College during the last week of July.

The only one of its kind in Canada, the school is undenominational and last year was attended by more than 100 representatives of eight denominations. The purpose of the school, under the direction of Padre W. A. Young, College Chaplain, is to provide for discussion of the problems that modern farmers are facing, and to give rural ministers a greater knowledge of the basic principles of agriculture in relation to human welfare and the function of the church in the rural community.

The school is a family affair, and the ministers are invited to bring their wives and families. Special programs are prepared for the wives and children. The two main courses offered are rural sociology and agriculture. The program also includes a visit to the Stratford Festival, a family picnic, and tours of various departments on the campus including the Ontario Veterinary College.

Numbered amongst the oldest in York County, this congregation began as a small Presbyterian group before the days of the MacKenzie Rebellion. Today, the enrollment is in excess of 200 members, and is growing steadily.

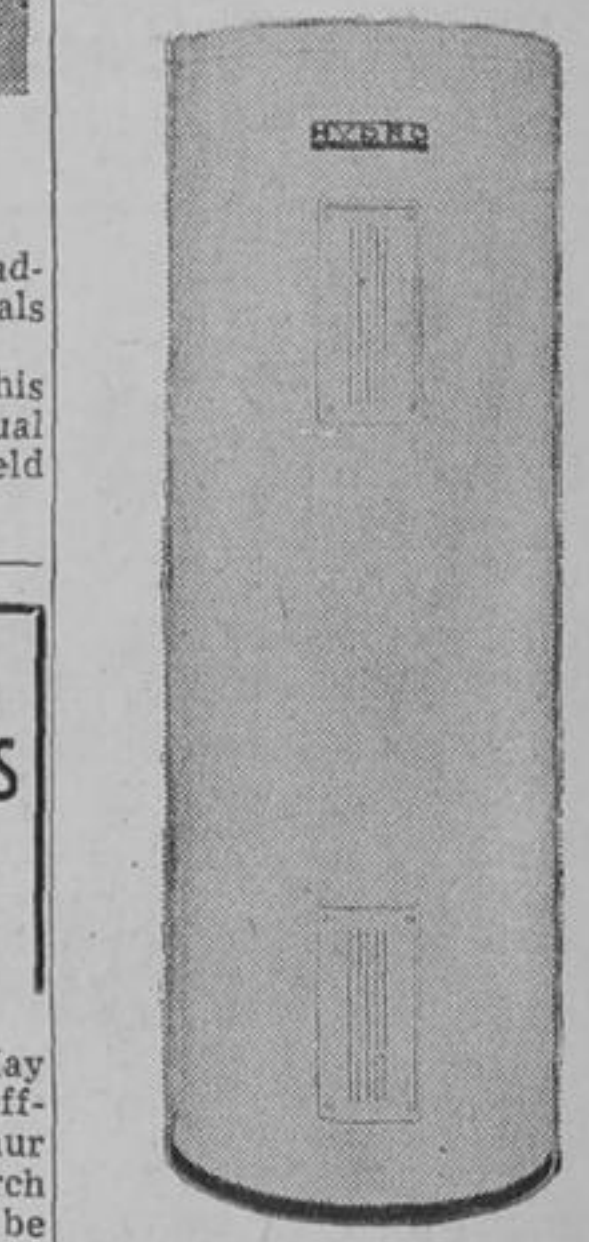
