**Thornhill By-Pass**

**New Four Lane Divided Highway From No. 7 Through To Bathurst St.**

Construction has recently started on a one and a quarter million dollar project, which, when completed, will see a four-lane divided highway extending from Highway 7 at Langstaff, to Bathurst Street in Vaughan Township. Project plans also include the paving of Bathurst Street from the junction of the proposed extension of No. 7 to the continuation of Highway No. 7 west of Thornhill.

The project is being undertaken by the Ontario Department of Highways and is expected to be completed sometime during 1963. Actual construction starts some 600 feet east of Yonge Street on Highway No. 7. The intersection itself is going to come in for considerable improvement as the whole area is to be channelled to enable drivers turning north on Yonge from Highway No. 7 to merge with northbound Yonge Street traffic without stopping. The present traffic lights are to be retained however, to control traffic crossing Yonge onto the new four-lane highway.

The four-lane extension of Highway No. 7 is to be about a mile and a half long and will take motorists over to Bathurst Street where another channelled intersection will enable drivers to merge with Bathurst Street traffic. Total length of the project is about 3.3 miles. The whole project is being handled by McNamara Road Construction Co. and McNamara Construction Equipment Co. The construction work alone will cost \$878,886.80 with the materials costing about one-third of this price. In spite of the construction that will be going on along Bathurst Street it is expected that the regular flow of traffic will be disrupted very little.
