## Historic Steeles Hotel Gives Away To Suburban Growth

A street name, and two benches made from the old bar counter, may soon be among the few remaining reminders of Steele's Hotel, which for more than half a century offered rest and refreshment to travellers on Yonge St. The weathered clapboard house on the north side of Steele's Ave., just west of Yonge was originally the front portion of this well-known inn. Recently it was sold for Miss Ruth Collins, by David McLean Ltd., and the new owners Messers Joseph Arrigo and J. V. DiGiulio, want the land for commercial purposes. Miss Collins gave the benches to the Pioneer Village at Edgely, and at one time it was rumoured that the house would be moved to the village and preserved as a museum.

Even in early days when Yonge St. was a narrow dirt road bordered by forests and farms, the junction of Yonge St. and Steele's Ave., was deemed a good place for business. In 1830 Joseph Abrahams built his Green Bush Inn on the north east corner, and in 1847, or possibly before that date, a second hotel was erected, on the north west corner. In 1857 this came in to the possession of Thomas Steele, and from then on was operated by him and his son John C. Steele, something of a record in this area where hotels changed ownership, management, and names with confusing frequency. This Inn was generally called Steele's, or the Poplar House, after the large poplar tree circled by a seat, which grew in the front yard. However, after Joseph Abrahams left the district to take up hotel keeping in Toronto the name "Green Bush" was sometimes applied to Steele's. Thomas and John Steele were respected innkeepers, and ran a good hotel, but as railway travel increased in favour, business at the Poplar House, as at other stopping places on Yonge St., dwindled in volume. By the end of the century the barrooms were their main source of revenue. When a lad, Mr. Wm. Francis lived across from Steele's Hotel and remembers that the ostler often came to his father's farm to pump water for the horses in his care. Dug wells were in use then, and they often went dry.
