To Widen & *Improve* No. 7 & Don Mills

The Toronto and York Roads Commission has announced that the Markham Township intersection of No. 7 Highway and County Road No. 8 (Don Mills Road), is to be widened and

improved. In its report to last week's county council session, the commission sought - and received - authority to expropriate land on both sides of Don Mills Road, 1200 feet north and south of No. 7 Highway.

The report pointed out that the commission has only to provide the land for the widening; the Department of Highways has agreed to carry out all the construction work. County also passed ex-

propriation bylaws to facilitate four other county-roadwidening projects in the north end of the county. In the report, the com-
