Predicts Health Fee Payment For Planning Head Plan For Canada

Fifty people Monday night heard Lorne Ingle, former national secretary of the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation, predict that Canada would have a comprehensive medical care plan within the next few years, no matter what party is elected next Monday.
 Mr. Ingle was speaking in the Richmond Hill Library to a meeting in support of Stan Hall, candidate for the New Democratic Party.
 He predicted that the Saskatchewan medical care plan, slated to take effect July 1, would prove such a success that other parts of Canada, and probably the United States, would be forced to inaugurate similar plans.
 Mr. Hall spoke briefly to the meeting, saying that Canadians need nothing so much as they need a comprehensive medical care plan to include drugs, and optical, dental, and surgical care.

Predicts Health Fee Payment For Planning Head Comes Under Fire From Council

Payment of \$133 in membership fees for Planning Director Harold Deeks came under fire at Monday night's meeting of Richmond Hill Town Council.
 Councillors John MacDiarmid and Mrs. Margaret Southwell along with Deputy-revee Thomas roadhouse took exception to payments made to four professional groups of which Mr. Deeks is a member.
 "I do not think we should pay membership fees for any employee unless the town derives direct benefits from them," Mr. Broadhurst told the meeting.
 The expenditure had been authorized on a motion by finance committee members, Mayor James Haggart and Reeve Floyd Perkins at a meeting May 30.
 Mr. Broadhurst pointed out that the planning board had authorized the payment in the budget and there was nothing council could do but pay it. He said future payments of this nature will be questioned before being passed.
 The fees were broken down as follows: Ontario Association of Architects \$85; Toronto Chapter of OAA \$10; Town Planning Institute of Canada \$35; and Central Ontario Chapter of TPIC \$3.
