Special Roads Committee Is Still Debating Future Course Bayview Ave

Three committees asked for special sessions of county council to consider and debate their reports, at the June meeting of the council. The welfare committee submitted a bulky report, suggesting that it and the tables of figures attached to it, needed considerable study before members could discuss it most intelligently. Both the police committee and the special roads advisory committees, however, told the council that their reports were not prepared, and asked leave to submit them at a special session, some time in July or August. The immediate future of Bayview Ave., between the Markham Road and Elgin Mills Sideroad, is in the hands of the special roads committee, where considerable discussion is taking place as to which roads the county will assume. Residents and businessmen who must use that mile and a quarter of Bayview Avenue have been complaining for some time of its condition, although the Richmond Hill Roads Department has been giving it special attention. Officials say it needs paving, because of the amount of traffic, but suggested that it is an arterial road used by property-owners in Metro and other parts of York County, and so should be paved by the county.

To Purchase Additional Supply From Vaughan Township This Year

Vaughan Township has entered into an agreement to supply water to Markham Township for the balance of 1962. The additional water will supplement the existing supply and relieve the pumping pressure in some areas of the township, according to clerk H. Crisp. The agreement terminates Dec. 1, 1962. Markham has guaranteed to purchase \$5,000 of water starting July 1, and ending Nov. 30. It will pay 40 cents per thousand and gallons. The agreement calls for the township to pay a minimum of \$1,200 in July; \$1,100 in August; \$1,000 in September; \$900 in October and \$800 in November. Township Engineer Dusan Miklas said the additional water will be used to service the district north of John Street in the Thornhill area. The line will cross Yonge Street south of Highway 7. Vaughan has agreed to restore two abandoned wells south of Steeles Avenue for the supply at a cost of \$8,264. The wells have not been in use since North York went into Metro several years ago. Mr. Miklas said the agreement was only a temporary one and that Vaughan would not agree to supply water beyond the end of November. Construction of a water tower on Bayview Avenue has been approved by Markham council and is expected to be completed later this year. When completed it will relieve the water situation in the township, Mr. Miklas said.

Begin Work Addition To Newmarket Hospital

Mr. W. A. Spear, chairman of the board of governors of York County Hospital, announced the entrance of equipment from Donolo Construction Ltd., into hospital grounds preparatory to construction of the long awaited hospital extension that will double the medical and nursing facilities required to service increased demands of rapidly expanding neighborhood communities. Construction of the new wing brings to a climax months of work by the building committee members, Mr. W. Hodgson of Kettleby, Mr. K. M. R. Stiver, Mr. Frank Marritt of Keswick and Dr. W. B. McClintock under the dedicated leadership of Mr. C. E. Boyd. Plans finalized by Somerville, McMurrich and Oxley will bring hospital capacity up to 265 beds and will provide special units for treating the critically ill, modern pediatric department, self care unit for ambulatory patients, 24 bed psychiatric section occupying the entire sixth floor, piped oxygen supply, immediate nurse-to-patient communication system, outpatient clinics and expanded diagnostic services. Newly planned building features bring to York County Hospital the ideal combination of efficient hospital care plus the newest features for patient comfort. W. B. McClintock, M.D., Chairman of the medical staff building committee confirmed the desperate need for expansion. He pointed out that 7,000 additional citizens from Newmarket, Aurora, Sutton, North Gwillimbury, East Gwillimbury, Whitchurch, King and adjoining Simcoe County will be provided with medical and hospital care ated among the most up-to-date in Ontario. Drs. P. Heyland, Bradford and J. McPhee, King City, medical staff members on the board of governors, estimated new out-patient and emergency departments would increase capacity from the present 12,000 to 30,000 patient treatments each year. Mr. E. W. Roeder, hospital administrator, advised all personnel that the "Famous Door" of York County Hospital is reopened as the main hospital entrance during construction. A newly paved automobile parking lot on grounds west of the hospital provides parking space lost during the building program. The total cost of the hospital expansion is estimated at \$2,995,000, financed by the County of York, Provincial and Federal grants plus public support.
