The establishments of courts in Newmarket and Willowdale. Both Mr. Hollinrake and Mr. Pearse emphasized that giving the appearance of justice having been done, "is as important as justice being done."

Mr. Pearse suggested, the person who was tried in a shabby court didn't have much confidence in the court's decision.

Mr. Pearse said, there had been a noticeable improvement in courtroom facilities in the province in the 12 years since he had become a magistrate.

John Addison recently elected MP for York North, praised the facilities of the courtroom, echoing the value of good facilities in maintaining a proper atmosphere for justice.

After recalling past magistrates in York County, Mr. MacKenzie praised Mr. Hollinrake as a magistrate who is able to temper justice with mercy.

Mayor W. A. Kent of Newmarket was the final speaker at the opening. He said that his town was justly proud of its courtroom facilities but conceded that they couldn't compare with Richmond Hill's.

Magistrates court was first held in Richmond Hill council chambers earlier this year. Traffic court has been held in Richmond Hill for many years.

The court chambers, which are located in the former headquarters of the senior citizens' club, are officially designated as an auditorium and are rented to the province.

In addition to Richmond Hill, the court serves the townships of Vaughan and Markham and the villages of Markham and Woodbridge.

## Two Commissioners Say "It's Time They Paid"

The recent ruling that Metro must pay York County \$153,061 has brought mixed reactions from two local members of County Council.

According to an Ontario Municipal Board ruling, Metro must pay that sum to compensate for the county's lack of revenue resulting from the Metro amalgamation in 1954.

Reeve A. H. Rutherford, Vaughan Township commented that after nine years it was too late to argue about the matter. "The county was left to itself," he said, "and we had a tough struggle at the start. We're on our feet now and it was no longer so necessary."

Mr. Rutherford said that it was hard to say whether the sum mentioned was adequate.

The suburbs which joined Metro contained 87 per cent of the township's population and assessment. Chief burden felt by the county was for road costs.

"The sum should have been paid long ago," commented Reeve Floyd Perkins of Richmond Hill. "By now it is a dead issue."

County Council had not discussed the question yet this year he said. It was hard to judge whether the sum is fair without further study, he added.

Both Mr. Perkins and Mr. Rutherford are county commissioners.

## Vaughan's Share Of Hospital Road To Be \$15,000

Vaughan Township has authorized an expenditure of \$15,000 to extend a road to the proposed York Central Hospital. The half-mile extension of Trench Street would improve the accessibility to the new hospital.

According to Clerk J. M. McDonald, the township would not move immediately to build the road. However, the bylaw had to be passed by July 31 in order to qualify for the provincial grant.

It was hoped, he said, that Vaughan, Markham Township and Richmond Hill, would get together to reach some agreement over providing services for the hospital. Building the road would be part of Vaughan's share of the burden.

The \$15,000 would be enough only to buy the right-of-way and provide a base for the road.

## Missionary Dies After Stabbing In North Africa

A Mennonite missionary who once farmed in Markham Township was stabbed to death yesterday in Somalia, North Africa.

Merlin Grove, who sold his farm to become a missionary was serving at a mission in Mogadiscio, the capital of Somalia. The stabbing took place while he and his wife Dorothy were registering a group of students for evening classes.

Mrs. Grove also suffered multiple stab wounds. No reason was given for the attack. The Groves have three children: Bruce, 10; Pauline, 8 and David, 5.

Mr. Grove, 33, graduated from the Toronto Bible college in 1959.

His parents are Mr. and Mrs. Russell Grove of R.R. 2, Markham. The Grove family has been living in Markham for five generations.

## Ratify Contract With Vaun-Hill Ambulance Firm

Richmond Hill and Vaughan Township have recommended that York County Health Unit sign a contract with Vaun-Hill Ambulance to provide service in the two municipalities.

A new agreement became necessary when Richmond Hill Ambulance Service defaulted on its contract. Appearing before Vaughan Township's finance and general purpose committee July 4, owner Roy McBrien reported that he had sold his old ambulance to Alf Bagley, owner of Vaun-Hill Ambulance and expected delivery of another in August.

According to the agreement, Mr. McBrien had to have at least one ambulance available at all times.

Mr. McBrien failed to appear before Richmond Hill Council and before a joint meeting of committees from the councils of Vaughan and Richmond Hill.

The new agreement with owner Alf Bagley of Richmond Hill is effective as of June 1. The two municipalities pay \$100 each monthly as a subsidy to the York County Health Unit which is in turn paid to the operator.

## Council Holds Up West End Report

The Rouge River sanitary sewage report has been temporarily halted on advice from Richmond Hill's Works Committee until council has had time to discuss the west area sanitary sewage report with OWR officials. Word of the stoppage came in the committee's report at a council meeting Monday night.

Committee approval was also installation of a sewer connection to the town system from St. John's Baptist Church. Approval was made subject to further investigation with the OWR and Vaughan Township by Works Commissioner Otto Whalen.

Committee approval was also received for the arrangements whereby all surplus fill available from Angus Robertson Ltd., York Central Hospital contractor, would be obtained for subsequent filling of the Hydro property on Mill and Trench Streets.

Works Commissioner Whalen was asked to meet with Vaughan Township officials to discuss the proposed southerly extension of Trench Street to the York Central Hospital on the Maple Sideroad.

## Takes Top Honor At Oxford County Show

A Richmond Hill dog has been chosen best of its breed at Saturday's Oxford County Dog Show, Woodstock. Ascot Command Performance, a wire-haired terrier owned by Hi-Tom's Kennels, Naughton Drive, Elgin Mills, was awarded top spot by the judges.

The dog finished third in a field of 19 in competition for the grand championship.

This is the second year in a row that Hi-Tom's has won the best of breed award, according to R. Saunderson, owner of the kennel. Ascot Command Performance's sire won the competition last year.

## Two Groups Get Grants From Hill

Grants to two local organizations totalling \$2,200 were approved at Monday night's meeting of Richmond Hill Town Council.

The Victorian Order of Nurses received a grant of \$2,000 down slightly from last year. Richmond Hill Horticultural Society got a grant of \$200 to help further its civic improvement program.

In a letter to the town, the society thanked council for the use of a room in the town hall and asked for permission to use the room again next year.

The two grants had been included in the 1962 budget.

## Approve Sketch Plans For Richvale School

Official approval of sketch plans for the new Richvale School has been received from the Department of Education. Notice of the approval was contained in the superintendent's report at Thursday's meeting of the Vaughan Township Public School Board.

The architectural firm of Hanks, Irwin and Pearson, has been instructed to begin work on the final plans and specifications.

The one-story building will include eight classrooms, a kindergarten and playroom.
