Approve Bus Transportation In Danger Areas

Parents of school children of Vaughan Township in the Jefferson, Concord, Sherwood districts and an area on No. 27 Highway will be deeply thankful to learn that the township school area board, meeting Thursday night, decided to provide transportation for children living less than two miles from school in these recognized danger areas.

Mr. Norman Jackman, business administrator, gave an outline of the proposed routes which will require two more panel buses, and was authorized to complete arrangements with Langdon's buses for the coming term.

Vice-chairman Mona Robertson reviewed the history of the transportation problem, and stated, in placing the motion, that the proposed plans included the people who are now paying for transportation of school children in two ways - through taxation and an additional sum for the transportation of their own children - in Jefferson, Concord and Sherwood. "These parents have shown a greater realization of the dangers," she said, "and I feel that they should be the first to benefit from an enlarged transportation program." Mrs. Dorothy Robertson was the seconder of the motion, which passed unanimously.

Two of the Jefferson parents, who have fought for the reinstatement of bus transportation in their area for the past year, thanked the board for their decision, saying, "You have no idea how it feels to know your children are walking on Yonge street."

The cost of the increased transportation service was estimated to be about one mill. Some savings are anticipated by co-operation with the boards of the high and separate schools.
