## Cold Water Defeats R.H. Swimmer

racked by violent shaking, the near-frozen athlete said he had never experienced cold like it before.

Ken's pre-race strategy was to swim two miles an hour and attempt to keep in 10th place until the 12th mile, then put an all-out effort in the last three miles to capture a spot in the first seven finishers and a share in the \$15,000 prize money.

He was confident that he could finish the 15-mile route. The only reservation he had was whether or not he could fight the biting water over the full distance.

His coach, Barbara Dennett, who last year completed 11 miles of the 15-mile grind, said Ken did very well considering that he was hampered by lack of proper training facilities. He did most of his training in Lake Wilcox, but had no chance to condi-

tion himself to the water conditions he encountered in Lake Ontario.  
Both Miss Dennett and Bruce Wilson, a University of Western Ontario student who acted as oarsman, shouted encouragement to the game young swimmer throughout his two hours in the water. They tried in vain to coax him on. But the cold water conquered.

From my vantage point in a CNE press boat about 20 feet away, I watched his perseverance to battle on in what many observers claim to be the most gruelling of all marathon swims.

Ken is already making plans for next year's swim. He said Monday that he will start training early next month for another try at that "pot of gold" which lies at the end of 15 miles.
