A short while ago, water users were asked to restrict lawn watering to a specified two days per week. We thank all those who co-operated by accepting these voluntary limitations.

The conditions which compelled us to make this request still exist and we have to ask that some prudence still be exercised in water usage for garden and lawn purposes to prevent a repetition of the earlier shortage.

Conditions are now such that a little more elasticity can be permitted and water may be used for garden and lawn watering at will. However, we do ask that as a safeguard for future supplies, you limit watering to any three nights per week of your choice.

Negotiations have been completed with the Water Resources Commission for the development of another well with a known capacity in excess of our present normal daily consumption, and should be in full operation by next Spring, thus assuring us of adequate supplies for the
