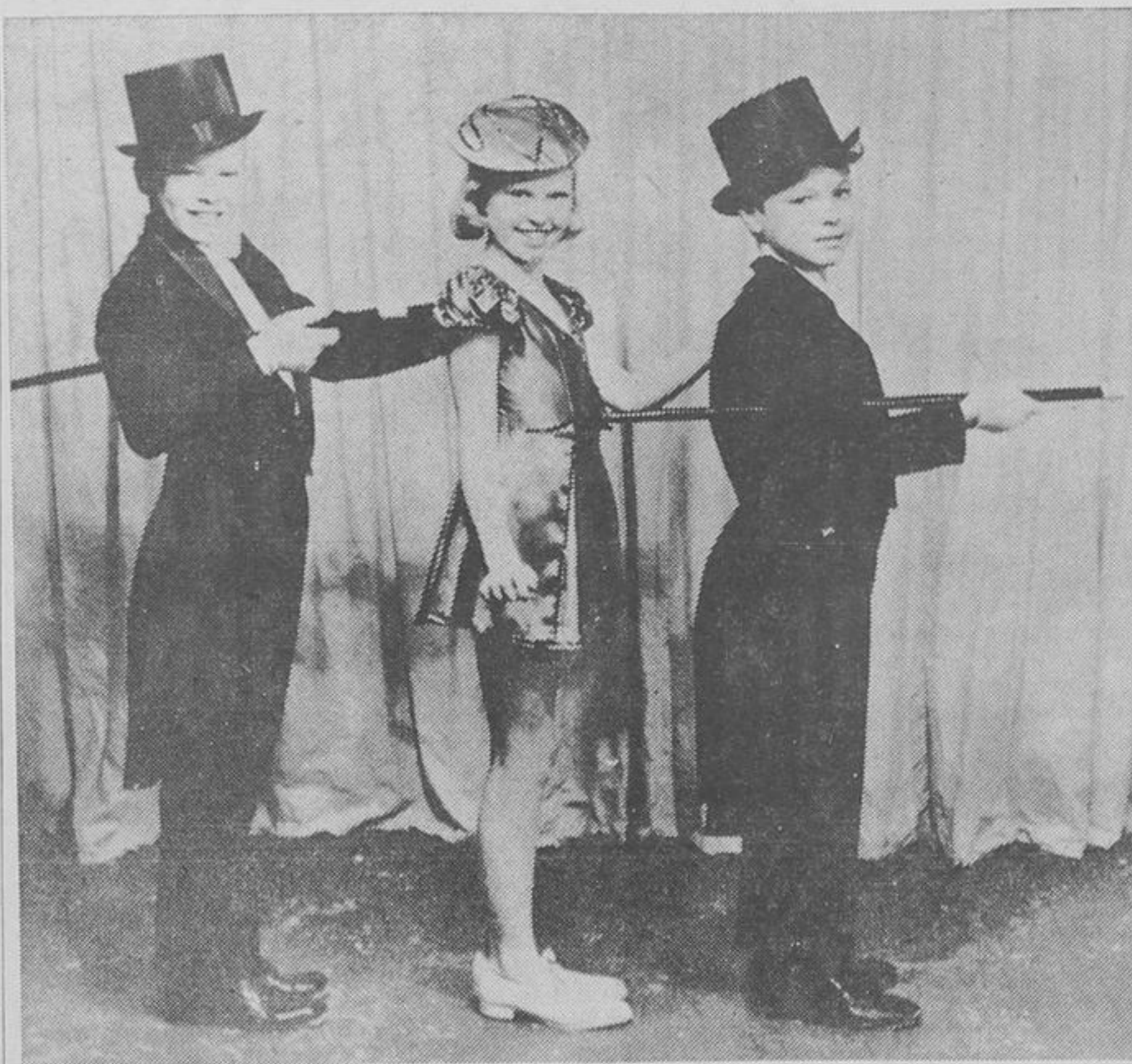

# Will Appear On Channel 11 Sunday

Officials of the Midmer Dance Academy, Richmond Hill, predict they will have to expand their facilities to accommodate increased enrollment. According to Eddie Midmer, there is already a large enrollment in the school from Toronto. He predicted that enrollment will have to be limited until other arrangements can be made. Facilities in Richmond Hill, already occupying two studios, will have to be rearranged to keep pace with the academy's growth, Mr. Midmer said. Plans are for a new studio to be erected near Highway 401 to accommodate students from Toronto. This means that the academy will have to transfer some teachers from its Uxbridge studios, since it takes some training for instructors to learn the MDMT system used at Midmer studios. Under this system, exercises are done away with and the pupil's special abilities are exploited. The basic philosophy of the academy is that the finished product is the most important thing. Commenting on the pressures from increased enrollment, Mr. Midmer said, "Whatever happens, under no circumstances do I intend lowering the standards of the school in which I pride."

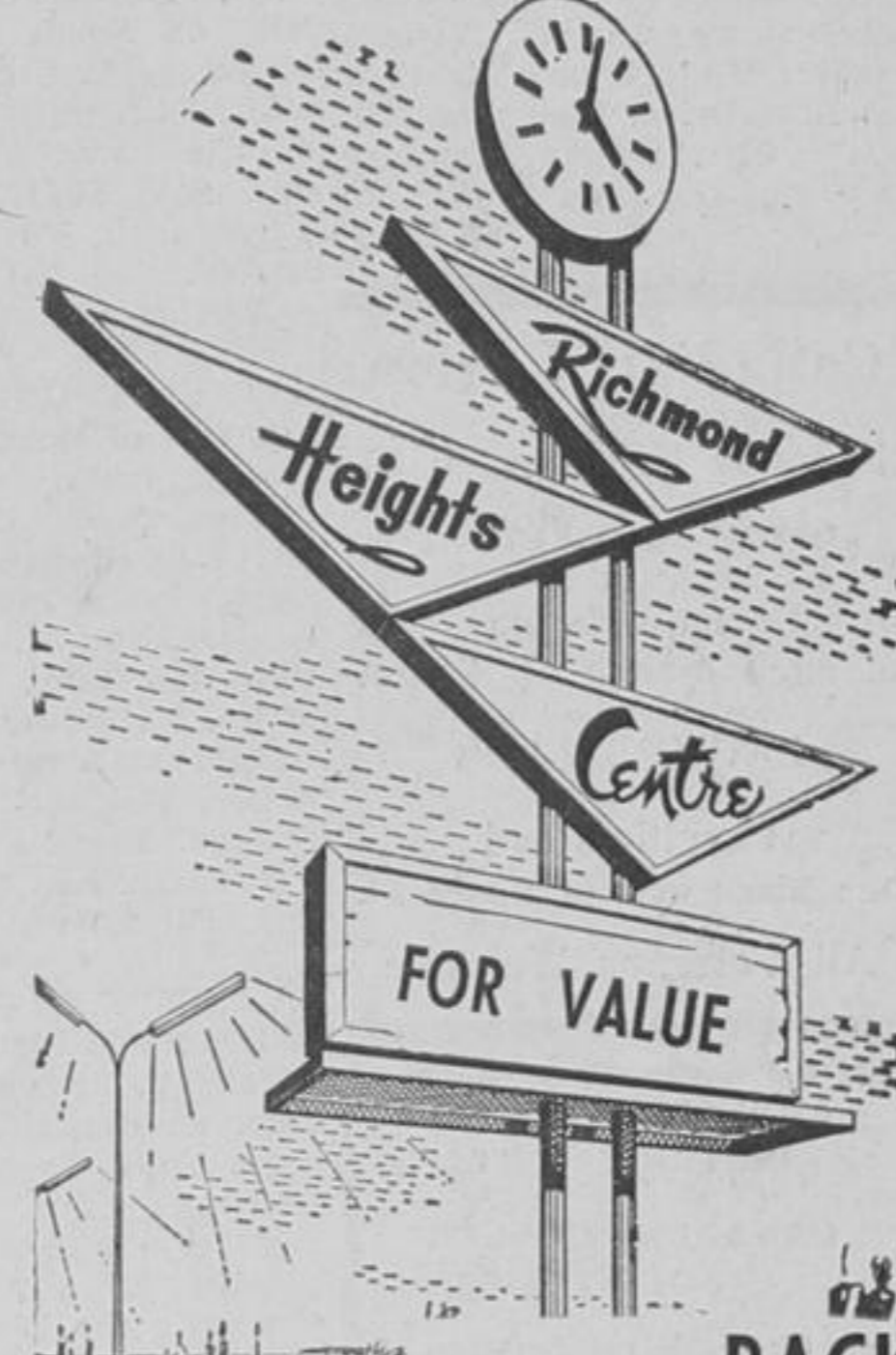
