ylene and liquefied petroleum trucks," the chief suggested. The plant is regularly inspected by the Department of Labor, Ontario Energy Resources, insurance company, boiler inspectors and the fire chief.

Also tabled before council was a report from Police Chief R. P. Robbins concerning the part

played by town police in the Maple disaster.

He said all available men were dispatched following the request from Maple shortly after 11 p.m. the night of the explosion. Chief Robbins said he organized police activities at the scene to conduct searches, set up road blocks, evacuate residents and control looting. Nearly 200 policemen were in the area at the height of the disaster, the chief reported.

Time spent by the Richmond Hill force amounted to more than 100 man hours over a three day period.

Co-operation between the various forces in the county was lauded by the chief.

"While there are many different police and fire units in the county, these two services need never wonder in regards to co-operation. This has been evident in the past, but never to this extent."

Churches Plan Member Survey

The four resident ministers in Richmond Hill East are presently planning a partial survey of the part of town lying east of the railway to identify the resident families according to their church connection. Already many of the families, perhaps most of them, are recorded by their affiliation with one church or another. It is now proposed to knock on the doors where the church records do not indicate the denominational faith, and ask for a declaration of church attachment. The information thus gathered will then be passed on to the various churches. Churches participating are St. John's Baptist, St. Paul's Lutheran, St. Gabriel Anglican, and St. Matthew's United.

The co-operation of the householders in the area will be greatly appreciated.

To Sell One Acre For \$3,734.25 On Elgin Mills

Purchase by a town manufacturer of slightly over one acre of land designated as green belt area, was approved by Richmond Hill Town Council Monday night.

The property, situated at the corner of Elgin Mills Road and Newkirk Road, is adjacent to land now owned by the company, Modern Sleep Ltd., manufacturers of foam sleeping units.

Purchase price of the property was set at \$3,734.25.

The company's request for a right-of-way over an existing one foot reserve on Elgin Mills Road for loading and unloading of tractor trailers was turned down by council.

Approval from the Ontario Municipal Board must be obtained before the sale can be finalized.

Mayor James Haggart said the one-acre site was not big enough to use as a park.

Council requested the planning board instruct Planning Director Harold Deeks to prepare the necessary changes in the zoning bylaw and official plan.

To Buy Land For Park

Approval in principal has been given the parks board by Richmond Hill Town Council for purchase of land to be used for park purposes.

The one acre site is situated west of the existing park lands

on Crosby Avenue. Council instructed the clerk to obtain two appraisals on the property.

The board has asked council to proceed as quickly as possible in order that proper growing can be carried out this fall.
